# WORLD MISSIONS COLLECTION

My dear friends in Christ,

Pope Francis has set October 2019 as an Extraordinary Missionary Month (EMM) to foster greater awareness of our mission to all peoples and to animate the missionary transformation of Church life and pastoral activity. **World Mission Sunday** will be celebrated in our diocese on October 20. In his message for World Mission Sunday, the Holy Father noted that this year marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Apostolic Letter, *Maximum Illud* of Pope Benedict XV. The title, "that momentous and holy charge" refers to the mission set forth in the Gospel of Mark, "Go into the world and preach the Gospel to all creation." (Mk 16:15)

One hundred years after that Apostolic Letter was issued, and nearly two thousand years since Jesus uttered that command, there is still much to be done. To do this work, as Pope Francis reminds us, "takes a constant and ongoing missionary conversion, going forth in mercy, and driven by love."

I invite you to reflect on these words of the Holy Father in his message for World Mission Sunday: "This missionary mandate touches us personally: I am a mission, always; you are a mission, always; every baptized man and woman is a mission. People in love never stand still: they are drawn out of themselves; they are attracted and attract others in turn; they give themselves to others and build relationships that are life-giving."

Your donations on this weekend are critical. The Pontifical Mission Societies serve the Church's universality as a global network of support for the Pope in his missionary commitment by prayer, the soul of mission, and charitable offerings from Christians throughout the world. These donations assist the Pope in the evangelization efforts of particular Churches (the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith), in the formation of local clergy (the Pontifical Society of Saint Peter the Apostle), in raising missionary awareness in children (Pontifical Society of Missionary Childhood) and in encouraging the missionary dimension of Christian faith (Pontifical Missionary Union).

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism. And it provides an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses. Thank you for prayerfully reflecting on how you are mission, and support World Mission Sunday in your parish.
