MONTHLY FOOD COLLECTION:

As we do on the third weekend of every month, we invite you to bring some items of nonperishable food with you to Mass next weekend to stock the shelves of our food pantry to respond to request for help from people in need. Useful items include peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal, stew, solid white tuna, mayonnaise, snack items, cookies, soups with meat, hot chocolate, tea and coffee.



As this bulletin goes to press, 119 donors have pledged \$307,468 to the capital campaign – 73.6% of target with \$122,987 coming back to OLA as pledges are paid over the next 4 years.

We urge those who have not yet responded to the invitation to participate to prayerfully consider what they might be able to offer. No gift is too small to help. Envelopes remain available in the pews of the church in addition to forms everyone should have received in the mail.

A NOTE TO THOSE CONTRIBUTING REGULARLY TO DEBT REDUCTION

As of the end of December of this year, we will stop putting in envelopes for debt reduction as people begin making payments on pledges to the Legacy of Hope Campaign.

Fr. Monroe would urge those who have been regularly making monthly donations for this purpose to consider making that same monthly commitment to the Legacy of Hope Campaign for the next 4 years – since a portion of our parish share of money raised will be used to pay off our DEF debt. For instance, if you have been giving \$25 a month for debt reduction, you can make a \$1200 pledge to Legacy of Hope and the parish will receive \$480 of that which will be used for debt reduction.
