**ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

Fr. Monroe will offer this Sacrament to those who can benefit from the healing prayer of the Church **after the 4:00 pm Mass this weekend and after the 8:00 am and 10:30 am Masses this Sunday.** He will do the same after the 6:00 pm Mass on Sunday, November 24<sup>th</sup>.



To date, 141 donors have pledged \$341,278 for the capital campaign – 81.6% of our target with \$136,511 coming back to OLA as pledges are paid over the next 4 years. It should be noted that \$500 of the total is a matching pledge from one donor’s employer. We need \$76,709 worth of gifts and pledges to reach our goal. ***We urge those who have not yet responded to prayerfully consider what they might be able to offer.*** No gift is too small. Envelopes remain available in the pews of the church in addition to forms everyone should have received in the mail.

**CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT**

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) was launched in 1969 by the bishops of the United States as a Catholic antipoverty initiative. For more than 45 years, CCHD has addressed poverty by attacking its root causes and funding community projects that promote independence as a means of finding a permanent end to poverty. It might surprise you to know that 46.7 million Americans, including one in five children, live below the poverty line. Many of these Americans are considered “working poor”—they work but do not make enough money to cover essentials like housing, health care, child care, and food. That’s why the CCHD theme is “Working on the Margins.”

This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD’s anti-poverty grants and education programs. *Seventy-five percent of the collection stays here in our diocese.* On October 21<sup>st</sup>, I once again had the privilege of meeting with our parish and community groups who received 29 local grants from this campaign. It is always inspiring to see how these small seeds grow into fruitful programs to support the dignity of people who find themselves most often on the margin in our cities and towns.

With a grant from CCHD, the Parish Peace Project in Chicago aims to address the continuing violence in Latino neighborhoods and the large number of struggling Latino youth and young adults. This project, a collaboration between 15 parishes and the Office of Young Adult Ministry at the Archdiocese of Chicago, works with those caught up in the criminal justice system, brings support services to schools, as well as providing mental and medical health services to the undocumented. By connecting pastoral ministry, restorative justice work, and community organizing, the Parish Peace Project prepares young at-risk Latino men and women to build safer and stronger neighborhoods in Chicago.

Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty. We are “working on the margins” in Central Massachusetts and across America. **Support CCHD Collection on November 23 & 24 and participate in the Third World Day of the Poor** called for by our Holy Father, Pope Francis.
