



Celebrating Mass at Resurrection

During the Flu Season & Coronavirus Contagion

Bishop Peter Libasci, the Bishop of Manchester, has delegated pastors in the diocese to help keep parishioners healthy during the outbreak of the Coronavirus contagion. Fr. John, therefore, would like to announce the following means for Communion during this time:

- If you are sick, ill or under the weather, you are not obliged to attend Sunday Mass. It is an act of charity that the Lord recognizes that you do not want to get others ill.
- Communion from the chalice will be suspended until further notice.
- If you suffer from celiac disease or allergic to gluten let Fr. John know before Mass and he will consecrate a low-gluten Host for you. Come to his line for Communion and let him know.
- At the Sign of Peace please do not shake hands but acknowledge God's peace with the customary words, and with a bow of the head or a gentle wave.
- Remember to come to communion with reverence, and either receive on the tongue or in the palm of your left hand placing your right hand underneath the left (*please do not pinch, grab or take the Host from the minister*). Also, please do not return to your pew with the Sacrament but consume it immediately.
- Remember to always wash your hands. Father John will greet people after Mass with a blessing and a word but will avoid handshakes for the time being.
