New scouts come to me if you have any questions about the library or want to see about a requirement.

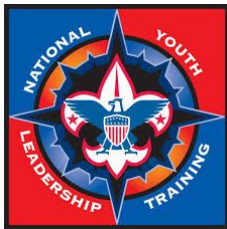
Troop Service Project to Saint Bartholomew Parish - Mulch
