**A NOTE FROM  
DEACON GEORGE . . .**

If you ask a child what they want to be when they grow up, you get a lot of answers: “Doctor,” “Nurse,” “Firefighter,” “Policeman/woman,” “Movie Star,” but you never hear: “Prophet.” Nowadays, most people think of a “prophet” as a fortuneteller or someone who predicts the future, but, actually, a prophet is a person regarded as an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God. In our readings this weekend, we see Amos, the prophet. He didn’t start out as a prophet. He was a shepherd. In fact, none of God’s prophets started out wanting to be a prophet. They were called by God to this vocation to proclaim God’s word to the people. God chooses us, we do not choose Him. All of us are called to be “Priest,” “Prophet” and “King” by our baptism. In doing so, we are to bring God’s word to others. This doesn’t mean standing on the street corner and screaming at passersby. It means living our lives according to Jesus’ teachings. It means as simply as loving God with your whole heart, your whole mind and your whole soul, and loving your neighbor as yourself. It is how we live our lives and treat others that we proclaim Christ to others.

In my own life, as a child, I wanted to be a Firefighter and/or a Superhero. I, actually, was a volunteer firefighter for ten years. I never got to be a superhero, but I have found that trying to help others is like being a superhero. We are all here for a purpose. All of us, no matter who we are. No matter how limited we think that we can help. We can be a prophet (or a superhero) just by reaching out to those around you with love. We can all be a prophet (or a superhero) by being prayer warriors and praying for those in need. We can all be Christ to others. God has called us. Let us joyfully answer his call.

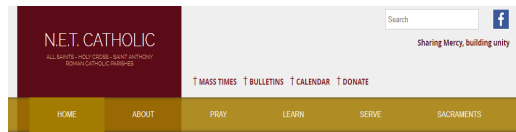
## Religious Ed. Listening Sessions

## St. Kateri Tekakwitha

On July 14<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the feast of the "Lily of the Mohawks." St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring and impaired eyesight. Despite tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.
