**A NOTE FROM
DEACON GEORGE . . .**

World War II has always loomed large in my family's history. My father and mother from Poland were made forced laborers for the Germans during the war, and my father, himself, served time in a Gestapo-run prison. I had family members, including one of my grandfathers, killed by the Nazis, and a great-aunt was sent to a Concentration Camp. Her crime was that she was a school teacher.

These past couple of weeks, the Church honored two Saints whose lives were also impacted by the War. Edith Stein was a German Jewish Philosopher, who started as an atheist, but converted to Catholicism and became a Carmelite Nun named Sr. Theresa Benedicta of the Cross. With her sister, she was killed by the Nazis in the Auschwitz Concentration Camp. Sr. Theresa stayed true to her faith in Jesus Christ and prayed that her life and death would be offered as a sacrifice to bring peace to the world. Pope John Paul II canonized her in 1998, and her feast day is celebrated on August 9, which is the day of her death.



Another saint who lost his life in the Auschwitz Concentration Camp is Fr. Maximillian Kolbe. Fr. Kolbe was a Polish Franciscan priest, who worked to spread a devotion to Mary, the mother of God. Before the war he wrote, founded a radio station, and travelled the world, even founding a monastery in Nagasaki, Japan. In Poland, after the Nazi invasion, his friary hid up to 2,000 Jews from the Nazis, but because of his friary's work against the Nazis, he and four other Franciscans were arrested by the Gestapo and sent to a Gestapo prison. Later, Fr. Kolbe was transferred to the Auschwitz Concentration Camp. One day in August, ten men were chosen to be executed as a punishment because of an escape. Fr. Kolbe offered himself as a replacement for one of the men condemned to death because that man had a family. In life, Fr. Kolbe spread devotion to Mary, so it is appropriate that he died on the eve of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 14 and was cremated in the Concentration Camp on August 15, the holy day of the Assumption. Fr. Kolbe was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1982.

World War II was not done with the legacy of Fr. Kolbe. On August 9, 1945, the United States dropped an atomic bomb on the mostly Catholic city of Nagasaki, Japan. Miraculously, Fr. Kolbe's monastery, which he had established before the war, survived the devastation.

In his novel, "Adventures in Paradise," James A. Michener wrote that "in war, good people become better and bad people become worse." During World War II, there were many acts of courage and bravery, but also acts of unspeakable evil. However, the examples of St. Edith Stein and St. Maximillian Kolbe show us what good people can do in the face of evil. May we strive to be good, even when it is hard.
