Next Sunday will be Sign Up Sunday

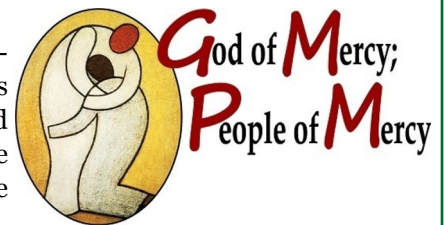
This year at all of our three parishes, we will have Sign Up Sunday on the Sunday after Labor Day. This is an opportunity for all the members of our communities to sign up for faith formation, to ask questions, to learn more about our different opportunities for service, and to sign up to join our different ministries.

In times when we grow closer in social media, yet further apart and lonelier somehow, in times when we look to the institutions and leadership at the higher levels and no longer find clear guidance, we ought to find support and strength in our local communities and our families, we ought to work to rebuild our local support networks so we can find the human fellowship, solidarity and leadership that we all need. When our bigger institutions fail us, we turn to our parishes and make them the center of our community life once again.



In the face of evil, we strengthen our ties to each other and to God through fellowship, prayer and learning. To do this, we have our new initiative **Growing in Faith Together (G.I.F.T.)**. On the weekend of September 8-9, plan to stay for a little while after Mass to learn more and to sign up; registration forms will be available.

In the face of evil, we redouble our efforts to do good and serve. We build our community and reach out in service to those in need through many different ministries under the **God of Mercy, People of Mercy** slogan. We know a God of Mercy and strive to extend that mercy to others through many different ways of service. On the weekend of September 8-9, plan to stay for a little while after Mass to learn more and to sign up; forms will be available.



Even though we might be feeling discouraged, we are a people of Hope, we know that God (Love, Goodness, Beauty and Truth) will be victorious in the end. We play this game of life as we would come to a soccer game if we already knew that we are not only going to win but that we are going to completely destroy the opposing team and send them home crying to their mommies (and the players are in their 30's!).
