A NOTE FROM

Fear Not! God is here.

FATHER DANIEL... These past few weeks have been difficult. We must continue to pray for all survivors of abuse and to keep all who are suffering very present in our hearts and minds. We must continue to seek ways to effect change in our Church. As all this darkness seems to take over, God has been intent in showing me that we are not to fear, that God is with us, very present, working hard. My invitation to you this week is that we do not allow the darkness to take over, but remain open to seeing the light, to seeing the ways in which our faith, in which our relationship with Jesus, in which our commitment to the Gospel and our life of prayer and community is giving its fruits. Sometimes I find myself being like one of those parents who are always bragging about their children, but it is just that every time I think about each of you, your stories, what you do, I just cannot cease to praise God for your goodness. When I come to visit someone at the hospital and in the midst of great pain and distress, all they do is ask about how others are doing and about how we will continue to build our parishes up, I am humbled and filled with hope by such generosity. When I ask someone in a hospital bed what they want to pray for and they list a bunch of people and do not even mention themselves, I know that God is good and strong at work in them. When I hear about one of you taking care of an elderly mother, a family and on top of that taking on caring for a lonely neighbor. I know that God is so very present and that the work of the Gospel will continue no matter what. When I hear of parents struggling through tremendous busyness, yet finding time to volunteer in their communities so their children can learn to be people for others, I know that darkness and evil will not prevail.

Do not be discouraged, do not lose hope, do not fear, just look around and you will see that God is here and at work! Thank you for being such wonderful witnesses to the Gospel, thank you for keeping my hope and faith strong through your openness to God!

In Faith Together Our new faith formation program is centered around adults. Only if the adults in our community, parents or not, are on fire with the Spirit, only if they know and love their faith, will we be able to provide our children with a faith community in which they can grow up to be committed disciples of Jesus Christ. Also, let's face it, adults need their faith much more, since they are the ones dealing with the many struggles of life and they are also the ones who can effect change in this world if their thoughts and actions are inspired and informed by their faith.

If you have no children, this program is also for you. You will have an opportunity to share with all ages during Mass and dinner, and then once the children go off to their faith formation, we can stay together as adults to learn about our faith. Do not worry, we will not be doing arts and crafts or playing games or having endless discussions with no guidance. Our Adult faith formation program is entitled: **Called to be(come) Christ.** It is designed to help you learn and rediscover your faith and all that the Catholic Church teaches, deepening your relationship with Christ and your understanding of our wisdom in nine 45 minute talks. These talks are centered around a theme each month, and you will be provided with additional resources for your prayer and reflection during that month, that you can use if you want. Father Daniel will be the one teaching at these nine talks.

Those who cannot drive at night and will find it challenging to come to our nine evenings have a number of options: 1) some of these months it will not be dark, so you can drive, 2) you can drive with someone else, 3) you will still be able to receive the materials and resources for that month.

Even if you cannot come to all nine evenings, sign up and come to the ones you can. If you are unsure if this will work for you, sign up, come to the first one and decide after that.
