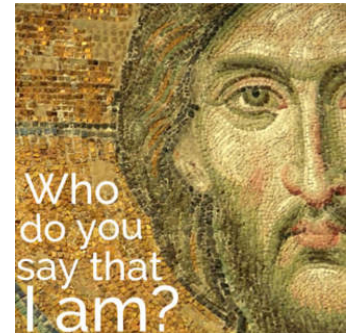

## A NOTE FROM DEACON GEORGE . . .

This past week, we observed the 17<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the September 11<sup>th</sup> attacks on the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and the aborted attack on the White House, which ended up crashing in a field in Pennsylvania. It seems that every generation has its defining moment. For some of you, it might be the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, or the Assassination of President John F. Kennedy, or maybe the Challenger Space Shuttle disaster, or it could be something wonderful, like the manned moon landing 49 years ago. Whatever the event, it is a moment etched in our minds.

One strange by-product of these events is the unfounded theories that people have about the attack on Pearl Harbor or the death of President John F. Kennedy. Some people even claim that the moon landing in 1969 was a fake (even though there were six more missions to the moon), and there are some who even believe that President George W. Bush was behind the September 11<sup>th</sup> attacks as an excuse for starting a war.

This was even true in Jesus' time. Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do people say that I am", and there were a lot of crazy ideas including that he was John the Baptist. Even after his death and resurrection, people claimed that Jesus faked his death, or that the Apostles hid his body, or that he never even existed at all.

Perhaps it is easier to believe these sinister theories than to accept the truth.

For instance, to believe in the death and resurrection of Jesus, one has to admit to certain facts. That God is real, and sin is real, and that we need to ask forgiveness for our sins.

To believe in the truth, we have to change our view of the world. As St. James says in our second reading: "If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well,' but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it?"

To believe in Jesus is to accept the idea that God wants us to help each other through our prayers and actions. Jesus says in our Gospel reading today: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

Believing in Jesus means believing that all life is sacred. It means believing that not helping others is a sin. As St. James says, "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?"

We must reach out to help each other, to be doers of good. Every generation has a defining moment. Let us make our commitment to Jesus that defining moment.

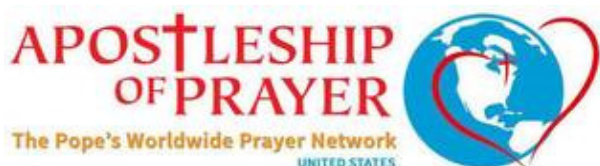
