### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is available for individuals upon request, and communal celebrations are periodically scheduled.

### Away for 16 days (October 22 - November 6)

On October 22, I will be going to Colombia to visit family and friends and to witness two weddings, one of a cousin on October 27 and one of a high school friend on November 3. I will be back on November 6.

During my time away, Father Richard Crawley, a Franciscan who was recently assigned to assist at the parishes in Trumansburg, Ovid and Interlaken, will be covering for all the weekend Masses for October 27–28 and November 3-4. The weekend schedule of Masses will remain the same. During the week, Word and Communion Services will be offered at our regular Mass times. Our usual lay leaders of prayer will be presiding and preaching at these services at All Saints and Holy Cross, and Dawn Burdick will be presiding at Saint Anthony.

During my time away, I invite all to attend Mass on November 1<sup>st</sup>, a Holy Day of Obligation on the Solemnity of All Saints. Since this is All Saints' patronal feast, all members of the three parishes are invited to join them in this special occasion for a 6:00 pm Mass followed by a dish-to-pass celebration. Father Crawley will be presiding.

Once I return and during the month of November, dedicated to remember our loved ones who have gone home to God, we will have a special Mass of Remembrance at each of our parishes: November 8 at 6:00 pm at Saint Anthony, November 14 at 6:00 pm at Holy Cross, and November 15 at 6:00 pm at All Saints. All are invited to attend these Masses, in which we will honor and remember the faithful departed in a special way.

While I am away, the parishes will be under Dawn Burdick's care and I will be in constant communication with her.
