A NOTE FROM FATHER DANIEL . . .

We received a grant from the Diocese for our cemeteries

As many of you know, our parishes have been fulfilling our Christian duty to bury the dead since 1851, through our Saint Patrick Cemetery in McLean and our Saint Anthony Cemetery in Groton. We make a commitment to families that we will care for their deceased loved ones in perpetuity, and we must live up to it. This is a costly thing to do over the years, and specially our Saint Patrick Cemetery was in need of a lot of maintenance and we really had no funds to take on such repairs. With a lot of work from Pam Senter, our N.E.T. Catholic Administrative Assistant, we applied for a grant from the Diocese to do some very needed work at our cemeteries, and **the Diocese awarded us \$23,425 for Saint Patrick Cemetery and \$4,500 for Saint Anthony Cemetery.** The repairs and maintenance work will be done before the winter comes. I am very grateful to Pam and to Gary Cornelius, our volunteer, who made all this possible and to the Diocese for awarding us this money so that we can continue to make our cemeteries beautifully kept places of prayer, where our beloved dead can rest in peace until the coming of the Lord. As we approach November, the month in which we remember all the saints and all of the faithfully departed, I invite all to visit our cemeteries and to pray for the dead. I also invite all to consider offering Mass intentions, Sanctuary Candles and the Altar Bread and Wine for the intentions of those who have died to whom we are united in the communion of saints.

I also invite all to consider Saint Anthony Cemetery (the only Catholic place of burial in our county outside of Ithaca) as a place for burial for you and/or your loved ones.
