**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL . . .**

**May Christ be King in our hearts, may our calling to happiness/
holiness come to fulfilment!**

Today is a day of celebration. We celebrate the end of the Liturgical Year and the Feast of Christ the King. But what does this celebration mean to us?

First, the celebration of the end of the liturgical year, and at the same time knowing that next week we begin a new liturgical year, reminds us that we are a pilgrim people, a people on a journey, a work in progress.

Thinking of the end of the year and of ourselves as a work in progress might make us think of all the unfinished projects, the shortcomings, the New Year resolutions that never came to fruition, the wounds that have not yet been healed, the sickness that lingers, and the relationships that are broken. That is why celebrating Christ the King is so important. Celebrating Christ the King is celebrating Christian hope. Christian hope is not mere optimism but the certainty that we are not alone in our struggles, that we are a work in progress because God is still creating us, walking with us, healing us, every step of the way. We know what awaits us at the end of the road. We know that at the end, Christ will triumph, Christ will be King, king of the world, and most importantly king of our hearts. This means the healing of all our wounds, the end of all our fears.

We know the beginning: the gift of life in the Father's love; we know the end: the gift of the fullness of life in the triumph of the Son; and we know the in between: a journey of ongoing healing, growth, creation in collaboration with the Holy Spirit. This is the reason of our celebration and our joy today.

In this pilgrimage of collaboration with the Holy Spirit, God in God's great love and respect for us has given us freedom and made us agents and collaborators in our own creation, in our process of becoming fully like Christ. The Gospel tells us how we can help God help us, transform us. The more we care for and love each other, the more we allow God to make us like Christ.

I want to suggest four ways in which we can help God help us:

- 1) Coming to Mass every Sunday to be reminded that on our journey, we are not alone. We journey as a community of disciples and God is at work in us and through us every turn of the way. God works very, very, very slowly—yet never gives up on us and is always at work.
- 2) Caring for those close to us, naked in their loneliness, hungry for love and support, imprisoned in their sadness or depression, in need of healing in their stories and relationships.
- 3) Doing all we can in use of our influence in society, in our political choices, in our professional activities to bring about the structural changes necessary so that as a society, we can clothe the naked, feed the hungry, care for the sick and treat prisoners in a humane way.
- 4) Focusing less on our shortcomings and more on being grateful for our progress, for our goodness, for the baby steps we have taken towards being all we are, for the small signs of God's progress in us. As we continue come to celebrate Mass this weekend, let us approach the table of the Eucharist in this spirit of thanksgiving and absolute trust in Christ the King, for our Christian hope is not mere optimism but the absolute certainty that God will win at the end over all suffering and fear!

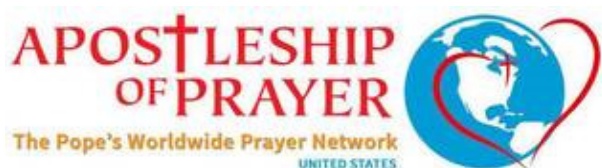
