**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL . . .**

Is prayer and rest part of your plan for 2019?

It is early enough in the year that if we make an effort, we might still be able to plan for some needed time of prayer and reflection, so I want to invite all to make this a priority and be intentional in scheduling it. In addition to our brief moments of prayer each day, we all need more extended periods of time in which we stop and focus on God. The Sabbath tradition in the Jewish faith, as well as our Sunday observance, go to this point of carving specific days or times in which we allow eternity to break into time, in which we pause, rest and dedicate ourselves only and exclusively to our relationship with God.

Go through your calendar for 2019 and see when and where you can dedicate a few days to the Lord. Time to go on retreat, or simply to stay at home, but set all things aside to spend time in prayer. Maybe you could take the days between the Wednesday before Holy Thursday and Easter Monday off (April 17-22) from work and dedicate yourself to rest, prayer and attending the beautiful church liturgies.

Maybe you can look into opportunities for retreat offered at so many Catholic retreat centers around the country, among which in our area Notre Dame Retreat Center in Canandaigua offers great programs, as does Christ the King in Syracuse, and you can always spend days of prayer at one of our monasteries: Mount Saviour in Elmira or the Abbey of the Genesee in Geneseo.

I myself have looked at my calendar. According to Canon Law, priests have 30 days of vacation a year, as well as eight days for retreat. In our diocese, foreign priests get two extra days vacation to account for international travel. I took 14 days of vacation in October and 16 days off in June when I was sick, so I have used up all of my vacation time until June 1st, but I have not yet used my eight days of retreat, so I will take four of these and go on retreat from January 21-January 25, which will be Monday-Friday. During that week, there will be no Masses on Monday and Friday. There will be a Word and Communion Service at the usual Mass time on Tuesday at Saint Anthony, on Wednesday at Holy Cross, and on Thursday at All Saints.

In our culture, we tend to give a lot of importance to work and activity in detriment of rest and prayer. If we do not carve our time for rest and prayer, we will lose our north — we will lose sight of Jesus, the Morning Star that guides us in this life and into eternal life.

As we celebrate Epiphany, I invite you all to make sure that in the journey of 2019, you keep your sight on the star, like the Kings, so that you do not get lost. Sit down with your calendar and make sure you carve out time for daily prayer, for weekly rest, for family time, for vacation and above all, for an extended period of time (three days minimum) to retreat from the busyness of daily life and re-center yourself in God, through prayer.

Make sure, as well, that you help your children and grandchildren learn the value of rest and prayer. This is part of the wisdom of the Catholic Church and part of your commitment to raising them in the faith to teach them that prayer and rest must take priority over activity, work, and a continual endless race for achievement. For the one and only race worth running, the one and only thing worth achieving is Jesus Christ and eternal life and friendship with Him.
