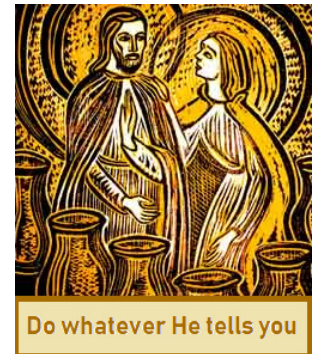

Those interested in becoming Catholic or wishing to complete their Christian initiation through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist are asked to call the parish office.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is available for individuals upon request, and communal celebrations are periodically scheduled.

Ministry to the Sick

Please call a parish office concerning the needs of the sick, hospitalized or shut-ins. Those unable to attend Mass may have Communion brought to them.

**A NOTE FROM
DEACON GEORGE. . .**

When I was a child, every neighborhood in downtown Ithaca had a little corner grocery store. In my case, the store for us was Joe's Red & White (later Jake's Red & White). The Red & White store was a magical place for me. Five cents, ten cents, and the almost unimaginable, twenty-five cents would get you comic books, soda pop, ice cream bars, candy, Twinkies, and little fruit pies. I still remember to this day the sights and the sounds and the smells of the Red & White store.

The Red & White stores went away and were replaced by supermarkets, just as the downtown department stores were replaced by the malls, and the malls are now falling victim to internet shopping. In life, things change and nothing stays the same, except for our faith.

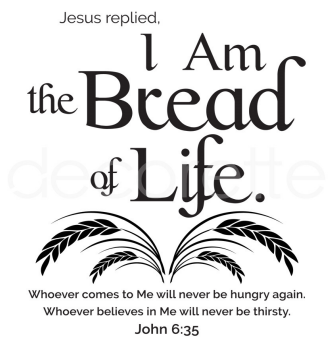
In the Letter to the Hebrews, the author states: "Remember your leaders who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings...(Heb.13:7-9)."

It seems that every year around Christmas and Easter, some new "discovery" or theory or study comes out about Jesus. I once asked one of my theology professors when I was studying to be a Deacon, why so many strange theories are always coming out about Jesus. They make a splash in the headlines and then they disappear. He said "Well, we have been studying theology for nearly 2,000 years, and theologians have to publish academic papers with something new in them."

Well, I am in my mid-to-late 60's now. I have seen a lot of strange beliefs and practices (some by my friends and family!), but I think the one thing that I have learned is that what was true 2,000 years ago is still true today. Our faith has survived the test of time, and what we declare every Sunday in the Creed is as true today as it was when it was written.

When I was a child, I used to be able to go to the Red & White store and receive food for my body. I also went to Mass each Sunday and received Communion (food for my soul). While the Red & White is gone, the Bread of Life is still with us because some things do last forever.
