**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL. . .**

The Domestic Church and Rituals

Each of our households, no matter what their configuration, is meant to be a domestic church. This is the place where we know, love and serve the Lord, this is the place in which we grow in our faith and help each other grow in our faith. The Lord knew us before he formed us in the womb and he has placed us in our household, our family, our group of friends as that place in which we can grow in hope, surrender to him in faith, and be transformed into love.

We transform our household into a domestic church by the use of ritual. Human beings are beings that relate to the world, to one another and to God through their five senses, and rituals help us relate to God's presence in our lives through things we can see, touch, smell, hear, taste, etc.

Our faith formation program for all ages has been providing a small at-home ritual each month to help in this process of transforming our household into a domestic church: a place in which our relationship with God is nourished every day, a place in which our children and grandchildren grow not only to know their faith in their minds but to actually live their faith, a place in which faith is part of our daily routine and activities, a place in which faith is the very way we relate to the world.

Part of the genius of the Catholic imagination and Catholic wisdom is ritual. Through ritual all of our senses are engaged, our whole being—body, spirit and psyche—are engaged in our relationship with God, our communication with God becomes part of the very fabric of our being, and even part of our bodily memory. How many of us, raised in a Catholic household, automatically make the Sign of the Cross as soon as we wake up, or sign ourselves when we drive by a Church? We do not even think about it, we just do it, it became part of who we are. These rituals we do might, at first glance to someone who does not really understand Catholic wisdom, seem like little silly things, as unimportant preschool-type projects, but to us who know the wisdom of the Church, to us who understand the sacramental economy in which grace is communicated through the material, to us who know that the human being is one indivisible reality and that external practices and rituals transform our inner realities, these things are not silly preschool projects but the very way in which we relate to God, enter God's mystery, collaborate with God's grace and transform the very fabric of our children so that becoming a people of ritual, they will always be open to God's work in their life.

This past month, we have been taking care of plants and saying a prayer every time we care for them and water them, and with this small ritual, we have been reminded each day that we must take care of ourselves and others by making the right choices, since our choices change who we are in this life and for eternity. Hopefully, all of our parish households have been making the right choices by incorporating daily prayer and ritual into their lives and will continue to do so, so that our households become true domestic churches. Hopefully, pride will not misguide us, like it misguided Adam and Eve, into thinking that we are better than this, that we know better, that God's design of communicating grace through sacrament and ritual is beneath us, that we do not take part in silly preschool projects, we do not do ritual. May God give us all the humility to allow ritual to enrich our lives, to allow God's way of communicating with us to transform us; may God allow us to set aside our pride so that we can surround our children with the wisdom of the Catholic Church and Catholic imagination so they can grow in hope, surrender to God in faith and be transformed into love.

This has been part of Church teaching for over 125 years. In New York State, farmworkers are excluded from this and other basic rights granted to other workers. They can be fired if they collectively bring a grievance to their supervisor.
