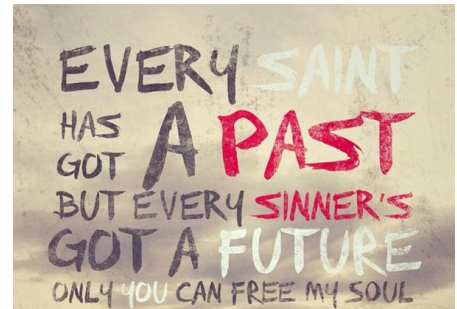

**partner to create the N.E.T. Samaritan Center
to serve all in North East Tompkins County**

In response to the growing poverty in the area of our parishes and our gospel calling to serve the poor, I have been working for a year to try to set up a way in which we can offer the poor some help that actually helps, and for that, what better than partnering with Catholic Charities, who has all the expertise. We were scheduled to begin with this Samaritan Center in January, but the Coordinator for Catholic Charities Samaritan Center has resigned and this created some delay. Michaela Cortright will be taking over the role of Samaritan Center Director, and Catholic Charities is still searching for the person who will be doing the coordinator role (this is the person who will actually be doing direct services at our location). It seems that we can start services at our NET Samaritan Center every other Monday from 10am-3pm as early as March 4.

The NET Samaritan Center will be able to provide emergency assistance with transportation, utility assistance, and security deposits for new rentals. Transportation assistance will be available to people in need with verifiable employment, medical, or educational need. Transportation services are only available as qualifies once every 30 days and are either bus passes or a gas voucher in the amount of \$10. Utility assistance can help with NYSEG shut-off notices (up to \$500); the client must have already used or have been denied HEAP benefits. We can offer this help to people once every 12 months. Security deposits are available on a once-in-a-lifetime basis for people moving within Tompkins County. We can help with \$500 for a 0-3 bedroom and \$750 for a 3 bedroom or above. We will also have a small clothing closet and personal care items. Recipients would be eligible for a personal care package (a bag which contains laundry soap, dish soap, shampoo, toilet paper and soap) once every 60 days, and 10 items per month of clothing.

Would you like to donate clothing or personal care items?

We will accept donations of gently used, clean clothing, laundry soap, dish soap, shampoo, toilet paper and soap. Place your donations in the bins in each church labeled *NET Samaritan Center*.

Would you like to volunteer to help with this new initiative?

Time commitment would be 10:00 am—12:30 pm or 12:30—3:00 pm on Mondays, and you can sign up for one or more Mondays a month. Training will be provided. The Center will be located at 375 George Road, Freeville, NY.
