**A NOTE FROM
FATHER DANIEL. . .**

Lent is almost here

Our readings this weekend invite us to consider a very lofty goal for our lives, a vocation that seems to go beyond every human possibility. We are called to love, yet this love is Christian love, one that is able to love our enemies. The Gospel phrases this vocation very simply: “Be merciful as your Father is merciful.” Our second reading from Saint Paul helps us understand what this means: even though we, in Adam, turned against the God that gives us everything, we became God’s enemies; God exercises mercy by turning toward us and offering us complete restoration and even more than we were initially given, for we are not just restored to Adam’s earthly nature but made sharers in Jesus’ heavenly nature, mission and destiny.

Every year as we prepare ourselves to celebrate and reenter this turning of God towards us, this extreme act of love, love for your enemies which is mercy, as we celebrate Jesus’ Passion, Death and Resurrection in the holiest of weeks, Mother Church in her love provides us with a time of grace in which the Holy Spirit helps us convert, this is turn towards God, so that in our mutual turning towards each other, the encounter can happen and truly experiencing God’s love and forgiveness, we can be set free. This season of Lent, which will begin shortly (Ash Wednesday is March 6), is our journey towards this encounter that sets us free through the offering of Christ. We will proclaim this truth of God’s mercy every time we repeat the memorial acclamation at our liturgies this season: *Save us Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.*

To help us in this journey towards freedom, since ancient times, the Church has recommended three simple practices: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. At N.E.T. Catholic we will be offering many opportunities for these practices this Lent. **I invite you to take some time to look over our Lenten Calendar and our Lenten Opportunities that you will find as an insert in the Bulletin this weekend and to plan ahead so that you can take advantage of what we will provide.** If you feel that not everything in your life is the way it should be, if you feel you need some healing, some freedom or simply to go deeper in your spiritual life, please do not let this special time of grace go by without being intentional about giving God some space to exercise mercy in your life, raise you up and set you free.

Catholics Speak Out for Justice: Equal Rights for Farmworkers

Next week you'll have the opportunity to sign our diocese-wide Public Policy Weekend petition in support of farmworkers. It will read: *The labor of tens of thousands of farmworkers brings food to our tables. However, New York State labor law categorically denies farmworkers basic rights and protections enjoyed by virtually all other workers. These exclusions mean that, unlike other workers, farmworkers do not have the right to: a guaranteed day of rest per week; overtime pay; employer contributions to disability insurance; public health protections including sanitation and housing standards; or protections while bargaining collectively. Farming is a vital part of the New York State economy. Economic policies that protect family farms are essential. We urge the legislature to support New York State farmers along with farmworkers. We believe that the sacred human dignity of every man, woman, and child, without exception, should be respected and that the basic rights of all workers should be recognized. Therefore, we urge the New York State Assembly, Senate, and Governor Cuomo to support the **Farmworkers Fair Labor Practices Act** ending the exclusion of farmworkers from basic rights and granting them equal treatment under our labor laws.*
