A NOTE FROM

Praying the Mass

Our Lenten journey is a journey towards freedom from the wounds that imprison us, the sins that burden us, and the



ways in which we hurt our relationships with God, with ourselves and with others. In this journey towards freedom, the Church has always recommended three practices: prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Among the practices of Lent, prayer is the most important, for it goes to heal our fundamental relationship, our relationship with God. The most important prayer we participate in is Mass. During Lent, make it a point to attend Mass on Sunday and if you are able even on weekdays. When you come to Mass, make sure it is truly an experience of prayer for you by participating actively. What prayer intentions do you bring to Mass? Are there things you want to give thanks for? Are there things you want to ask for? Are there things you want to ask forgiveness for? What is God saying to you through the readings? What is God inviting you to? How is God reassuring you of God's love and offering you the strength you need to get through another week? etc.

To help you be more intentional at Mass during Lent, we will be asking our greeters to hand out the hymnals at the entrance of church with a guide to the numbers for the readings and songs; please make sure you get them as you enter. We will also refrain from putting out or giving out the bulletins before Mass, so that if you have a few minutes to spare before Mass, instead of being distracted reading the bulletin, you can use them to pray and prepare your heart for the celebration of Mass and so that the bulletin does not become a source of distraction even during Mass. As we leave the church, we ask that you do not leave the hymnals in the pews but instead bring them back to the greeters as you exit, and at that point they will be distributing the Bulletin, so you can take it home and make it part of your Sunday reading.

Please participate actively, respond, pray and sing. We give God at least this one hour a week, and God through the Mass comes down to meet us; Jesus makes himself truly present upon the Altar—let us too make an effort to be truly present to God during Mass.
