## A NOTE FROM DEACON GEORGE . . .

This Sunday (April 28, 2019) is Divine Mercy Sunday. If you are unfamiliar with the Solemnity of Divine Mercy, it is based on the visions of a Polish nun and Saint named Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska. Through these mystical visions, Saint Faustina received a message of mercy and love from our Lord, that she was told to spread throughout the world. Saint Faustina died of tuberculosis in 1938, but for four years prior to that, she recorded all the revelations and mystical experiences that she received from Jesus and Mary, along with her own thoughts and prayers in a diary. For many years after her death, her writings spread, and in 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized her and officially made the second Sunday after Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday.

Her message to the world is simple: God loves us and is always ready to forgive us. In return, God asks us to show mercy to others. Jesus revealed to Saint

Faustina many ways that we may ask for God's Mercy, including the Chaplet of Mercy, which can be prayed on a rosary; the Novena of Mercy, which is prayed for nine days from Good Friday to the Saturday after Easter; and that three o'clock is the hour of Divine Mercy since that was the time that Jesus died.

I first learned about Saint Faustina and her revelations many years ago, and this year will mark the twentieth year that I have led a Divine Mercy Service on Divine Mercy Sunday. You are all welcome to come to Holy Cross Church at 3PM on Sunday April 28, 2019, to experience God and His Divine Mercy in praying the Chaplet, the Rosary and participating in Adoration of the Blessed Eucharist.
