A NOTE FROM DEACON GEORGE. . .

In the Book of Revelation, it states:

“A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child... (Rev. 12:1)”

This woman symbolizes many things. People have said that she symbolizes the Church, Israel and, of course, Mary, the mother of Jesus.

This past weekend, we celebrated May Crownings in all three of our Churches to honor Mary. This simple ritual dates back hundreds of years, and gives us a chance to reflect on Mary's role in the history of our salvation. Last Monday, May 13, was the anniversary of the Our Lady of Fatima. In 1917, Mary appeared to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima in Portugal. The Blessed Virgin told the children that she had been sent by God with a message for all of us. She came with a message of peace, hope and love and a call for us to pray to end the violence in our world. During the course of the apparitions, Mary and the Angels taught the children five unique prayers that are a message of hope and peace for us to recite.

“My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, and I love You! I ask pardon of You for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love You!”

“Oh my Jesus, I offer this for love of Thee, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.”

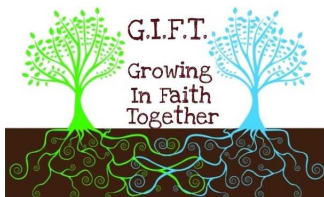
“Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fire of hell. Lead all souls to Heaven, especially those most in need of Your mercy.”

“Most Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit- I adore Thee profoundly.
