### **The Gift of Hope**

On May 20-24, I had the tremendous blessing of being invited to join the Cornell Hockey Team in their service trip to Don Juan in the Dominican Republic. The group consisted of Mike Shafer, their head coach and his daughter Michelle; Sean Flanagan, their assistant coach and his girlfriend Heather Philip; and five players: Jeff Malott, Zach Bramwell, Brenden Locke, Kyle Betts, and Cody Haiskanen. Also making the trip were Tony Eisenhut and his daughter Emily, along with husband Tom D'Alessandro.

This service trip was part of a long standing relationship with the Portal de Belen Foundation, which Father Ron Gaesser formed in 2001. Father Ron, in his retirement, moved to the Dominican Republic to serve the poorest among the poor. With support from many people, among whom are parishioners from Saint Catherine's, All Saints and Holy Cross, the foundation over the last 18 years has been able to create two schools, build a number of churches, build over 700 latrines, several houses, and help hundreds with immediate assistance such as clothing, food or medical expenses. Most recently, three years ago they started Project Rachel, a school with a mission of helping children who have Down Syndrome, are autistic, and those who have suffered brain trauma. The school provides resources to children who would not otherwise have access. They are provided with education, food, and financial assistance for medical needs. In our short four days in Don Juan, the group was able to:

- 1) Distribute 180 baseball uniforms, 100 pairs of cleats, hats, bats, gloves and balls.
- 2) Distribute 120 *Days for Girls* kits provided by Sewing Saints, a ministry housed at All Saints.
- 3) Distribute 20 water filters.
- 4) Build 3 latrines.
- 5) Dig the trenches for the foundation for a house.
- 6) Distribute clothing and shoes to Haitian villages.
- 7) Resurface the baseball diamond in Don Juan.
- 8) Visit Project Rachel.

What a gift it was to be able to come along! This trip was a profound experience of hope. First, in the sense that hope is trusting that God will be victorious, that God's goodness is constantly at work. To see all the members of the team work with extreme generosity, using every little bit of their energy to dig trenches or do what ever is necessary under the burning sun in at least 90 degrees weather was so beautiful! I tell you the goodness and generosity of these young and not-so-young people was clear proof of God's goodness powerfully

present and at work in our world. To each and every one of them, my deepest admiration and gratitude—what a witness you were to me and to all! To see how beyond the differences of culture, language and race our team and the people in Don Juan came together in work and play, how both sides embraced each other in openness and an awareness of shared humanity as true brothers and sisters, was such a revelation of the truth of our oneness in the same Father, in times when polarization and discrimination seem to be the evil one's favorite way to tempt humanity. There is hope, we can be one and care for each other, we can serve one another generously! Meeting Father Ron and discovering his love for the poor, his generosity and commitment to continue to serve Christ truly present in the least of our brothers and sisters even at his age (83) and with all the challenges that come from being in a foreign country and culture was such a challenge to renew my own commitment to my priesthood and my ministry. He welcomed me truly as a brother, and to him for his witness and hospitality I am also deeply grateful.

It was also an experience of hope, in the sense of our active Christian hope, that certain of God's victory, fully commits to bring about God's kingdom in this world. In the sense of our responsibility to see that justice reigns in this world and all of God's children can live with dignity.

In this sense, my congratulations to the Portal de Belen Foundation for being an agent of that active hope in building the Kingdom in the Dominican.

A special thank you to Mike and Diane Shafer and Tony Eisenhut for thinking of me and making this trip possible for me.

This trip has given me much to think and pray about, and I think its fruits will continue to unfold in my life in the years to come. For now, I must say that I would like to find ways in which I can personally support the foundation and that Project Rachel is a very important and meaningful project, and I would love to find ways for our parishes to support this effort.

I also hope that we can engage the amazing people from Cornell Hockey to help us with some service projects in our parishes this fall.
