A NOTE FROM DEACON GEORGE . . .

This weekend, we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday, where we honor God as three persons in one: God the Father, God the Son (Jesus) and God the Holy Spirit. However, one of my former instructors at St. Bernard's once told me that the best way to commit heresy is to preach or write about the Trinity. That's because the Trinity is a Mystery and not easily explained. Even so, the concept of the Trinity is central to the belief of all Christians. All Christian baptisms must be made in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and if they are not, they are not considered as valid Christian Baptisms. In fact, a religious sect cannot be considered to be Christian if they do not believe in the Trinity. That is why religious groups like the Mormons (while considering themselves to be Christian) are not considered Christian by other Christian churches.

The concept of the Trinity is not defined or explained in the Holy Bible, but it is alluded to in many places. Early Christians struggled in understanding the nature of God, and His relationship to Jesus and their relationship to the Holy Spirit. Toward the end of the first century, it was clear through the writing of Pope Clement I and the early Church Fathers that there was a belief that God was three in one, but the question remained how that relationship existed. Many years and councils and theological thought have gone into trying to understand the mystery of the Trinity.

The Catholic Church teaches that the Trinity is One. God is one God in three persons, and each person is God whole and entire. These divine persons are really distinct from one another. They are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: "It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds. (Lateran Council IV (1215): DS 804.)"

I like to simplify my belief in the Trinity by saying that the Trinity exists in a relationship of love. The Father loves the Son and the Son loves the Spirit and all three love each other. A love so strong that as in marriage where two become one in a loving relationship, so the Trinity is one in love.

Legend has it that St. Patrick held up a shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity to the Irish people. A shamrock is a single plant but with three distinct parts. Though distinct, the parts cannot exist without the whole. That is true in a marriage, and that is true about God. Just as God is one in three, so we are one in unity with the Trinity, and the bond that holds us all together is love.
