RCIA/RCIC

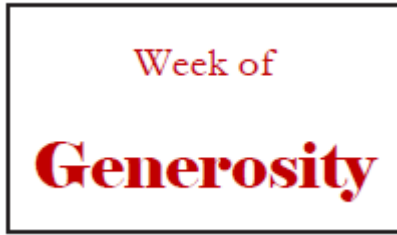

"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 2:5

This summer we will be reflecting on the various gifts and fruits of the Spirit that build up the Church. Our families received a package of 16 wrapped blocks at our Pentecost Celebration at Myers Park. If you do not have one, please take one of the gift bags in the back of the church. Each week, one block will be unwrapped and the gift or the fruit revealed. This week, we will unwrap the third block you received and find the word **GENEROSITY** on it. Sometime this week, take 15 minutes, and either on your own or with your family, invite the Holy Spirit to come to your household:

Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

After offering this prayer, reflect on the following:

KNOW (Mind/Knowledge/Memory):

What is Christian GENEROSITY?

Generosity isn't just donating money or simply giving in general. No, being truly generous is being selfless in the service of others in terms of things created or actions performed. It's a complete giving of one's self for the sake of the love of God and neighbor in every sphere of our lives; knowing that God, indeed, takes care of us and desires to give to us what we truly long for. Generosity is going the extra mile to offer ourselves for the good of those who do not even deserve it. This is what God does in Jesus. This is what Jesus does in the Most Holy Eucharist, in which he offers his Body and Blood to us as true nourishment for our salvation.

LOVE (Heart/Understanding/Understanding):

Accepting the fruit of GENEROSITY into our hearts.

- Experience God's generosity towards you: Reflect on all God has given you, especially in the gift of Jesus. God gave up his Son to save you. He renews that gift every time you participate in the Eucharist, no matter what.

- Experience God's generosity through you: Bring to mind the occasions in which you have found yourself serving or doing something good for someone that you do not particularly care for, and the peace and joy that such generous service has brought you. God has been able to make you an instrument of his unrestricted generosity.
- Experience God's call to renewed generosity: Consider in which of your relationships God might be calling you to renewed generosity, to serve and offer your life in love, even for those who have done little or nothing to respond to your kindness.

SERVE (Hands/ Wisdom/ Will):

Putting our GENEROSITY in service of the church, humanity, and the world.

This week you might try one or more of the following:

- Spend more quality time with others, especially in your family. If you do not have much time, make sure that in the short moments you spend with others, you are truly present and not distracted by devices or other activities. Spend time especially with those whom you might have been distant lately.
- Listen. Set aside the preconceived images you have of the members of your family and listen to them with renewed generosity; try to see the feelings behind their words and actions. Try to rediscover their goodness.
- Share. Be generous in sharing with others, especially with sharing your dreams and fears, your feelings, etc.
- Let someone else have the best part. Let others take the biggest piece of meat, or the last slice of the cake, or win an argument for a change.
- Take on a task for someone else. Offer to do a chore they usually do.
