# Peace

*"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 2:5*

This summer we will be reflecting on the various gifts and fruits of the Spirit that build up the Church. Our families received a package of 16 wrapped blocks at our Pentecost Celebration at Myers Park. If you do not have one, please take one of the gift bags in the back of the church. Each week, one block will be unwrapped and the gift or the fruit revealed. This week we will unwrap the fourth block you received and find the word **PEACE** on it.

Sometime this week, take 15 minutes and either on your own or with your family, invite the Holy Spirit to come to your household:

*Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.*

After offering this prayer, reflect on the following:

## **KNOW (Mind/Knowledge/Memory):**

### **What is Christian PEACE?**

"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you."

John 14, 27

Peace is a gift from God. One that we receive from Christ. One that we receive through the Sacraments; the Mass and Reconciliation end with the words "Go in Peace." One that is within us by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Peace is before all else, an interior thing, belonging to the spirit, and its fundamental condition is a loving and filial dependence on the will of God. There is nothing to fear.

## **LOVE (Heart/Understanding/Understanding):**

### **Accepting the fruit of PEACE into our hearts**

- Recognize and accept your weaknesses. One of the primary causes of unrest within ourselves is our need to be perfect. No human being is perfect, with the exception of Christ Jesus. No matter how hard you try, you will never attain perfection on your own. You will only attain perfection when you are purified when you meet the Creator and Author of Life in heaven. So give yourself a break. If something isn't turning out the way you had hoped, ask yourself

what the Holy Spirit might be saying to you. You cannot control everything. As you work and work to attain perfection, you are likely inhibiting the Spirit of Creativity and Surprise to move in your life. As you recognize your weaknesses and realize that it really is okay to make mistakes, you will feel more peace in your soul.

- Give yourself permission to slow down and be quiet. Our culture drills it into us that we need to keep moving: work to make money to buy things; get your kids involved in lots of activities so that they will succeed in life; idleness is bad. God, on the other hand, gave us the Sabbath. God so recognized our need for rest that God told Moses, "You must tell the Israelites: 'Take care to keep my Sabbaths, for that is to be the token between you and me throughout the generations, to show that it is I, the Lord, who makes you holy'" (Exodus 31:13). Our bodies need to rest in order to function. Our souls need to rest in order to cultivate peace within. Make time to just be, without doing. This may be very difficult at first, but just keep trying.
- Forgive yourself. One of the most difficult lines of the Lord's Prayer is "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." The "those" that we need to forgive includes ourselves. It seems that it is more difficult to forgive ourselves than it is to forgive others. God loved you into being and so God will do everything God possibly can do to keep you close, including forgiving for any and every sin you will ever commit. God's mercy is beyond human understanding. Each and every day, accept God's mercy. At the end of each day, tell yourself, "I forgive you."

## **SERVE (Hands/Wisdom/Will):**

### **Putting our PEACE in service of the church, humanity, and the world.**




This week in your relationships with others, especially family, try to help them accept the gift of peace by:

- Inviting them to do things that will help them slow down and rest,
- Sharing forgiveness with others,
- Letting go of grudges,
- Reminding others that it is okay to make mistakes as long as they remain open to growth in the Holy Spirit,
- Encouraging and being kind instead of pointing out failures and criticizing.

**Question of the Week:** How has the Holy Spirit brought peace into your life?

## A Note from Steve Cardinal

*To the parish community of St. Anthony and Holy Cross:*

*I've been involved with the Rosary in the parish for 29 years. It has been very rewarding and a great help to me over the years. When I started coming, we had a packed chapel every week! When our leader retired, I started to lead the Rosary and did for a number of years. When Fr. Lioi was here, I and two others started Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of the month. Over the years, I switched to Wednesdays for Adoration, hoping to pick up more support. Eventually, we arrived at today's schedule of 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday for Rosary and Adoration, and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> Thursday for Rosary and Chaplet of Mercy. We had Adoration in the church up until last winter and have been in the chapel again lately. Over this time, attendance has fallen off, with age a big factor, deaths, people moving away, and no new people to take their place. Holy Cross people came for quite a while, but happily they started Adoration at Holy Cross Church. Up until two weeks ago, I had a very supportive man from Holy Cross and one woman from St. Anthony's, who came when she could leave her husband for a short time, but who also went to Florida in the winter.*

*So with a heavy heart, I am closing this chapter of my service to you, the parishioners of St. Anthony's. I encourage anyone who would like to go to Adoration or Rosary to refer to the schedule in the bulletin.*

*It's been a blessing for me and my family to have served in this capacity for so long. Thanks to everyone for your support over the years.*
