Patience

"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 2:5

This summer we will be reflecting on the various gifts and fruits of the Spirit that build up the Church. Our families received a package of 16 wrapped blocks at our Pentecost Celebration at Myers Park. If you do not have one, please take one of the gift bags in the back of the church. Each week, one block will be unwrapped and the gift or the fruit revealed. This week we will unwrap the sixth block you received and find the word **PATIENCE** on it.

Sometime this week, take 15 minutes and either on your own or with your family, invite the Holy Spirit to come to your household:

Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

After offering this prayer, reflect on the following:

KNOW (Mind/Knowledge/Memory):

What is Christian PATIENCE?

21st century American culture promotes instant gratification: If you want it, you need it NOW! To live as a person filled with the Spirit is to be counter-cultural. If your focus is on God, nothing else will be as important, and so you will be able to nurture the fruit of patience. We often hear people say that they need more patience. "I need more patience... when dealing with my children, when dealing with my coworkers, when dealing with my spouse..." Patience seems to be a sought-after virtue.

LOVE (Heart/Understanding/Understanding):

Accepting the fruit of PATIENCE into our hearts

Be deliberately counter-cultural. As you're shopping, when you find something in the store, don't give in to the culture's "got-to-have-it-now" mentality. Gaze at it for a few moments, then walk away. When you get home and over the next couple of days, pray to God for insight as to whether you should really have that item. If you find that you aren't thinking about the item, you're probably able to live without it so you really don't need it. (This will also help keep your finances and clutter under control!) Take a step back. The practice of counting to 10 really does work. If you feel yourself getting frustrated with your children, spouse, co-workers, or friends, close your eyes, take a deep breath and count to 10 or even better, pray a short prayer (Glory Be, Hail Mary, Jesus help me...)

SERVE (Hands/Wisdom/Will):

Putting our PATIENCE in service of the church, humanity, and the world.

- ♦ When talking with someone difficult this week, practice patience by trying to listen joyfully.
- ♦ Practice patience with yourself. When you don't live up to your expectations, give yourself a break.
