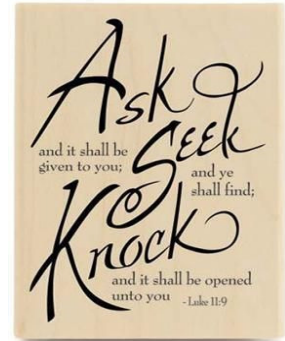

Discernment

"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 2:5

This summer we will be reflecting on the various gifts and fruits of the Spirit that build up the Church. Our families received a package of 16 wrapped blocks at our Pentecost Celebration at Myers Park. If you do not have one, please take one of the gift bags in the back of the church. Each week, one block will be unwrapped and the gift or the fruit revealed. This week we will unwrap the sixth block you received and find the word **DISCERNMENT** on it.

Sometime this week, take 15 minutes and either on your own or with your family, invite the Holy Spirit to come to your household:

Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

After offering this prayer, reflect on the following:

KNOW (Mind/Knowledge/Memory):

What is Christian DISCERNMENT?

Discernment (often referred to as Counsel) is one of the Gifts of the Spirit. At some point, we've all sought an opinion from a trusted friend when trying to make a tough decision. The Spirit's gift of discernment takes that one step further. It is when God, himself, through his spirit, enlightens our heart so as to make us understand the right way to speak and to behave and offers the way to follow. Counsel, then, is the gift

through which the Holy Spirit enables our conscience to make a concrete choice in communion with God, according to the logic of Jesus and his Gospel. In this way, the Spirit makes us grow interiorly, he makes us grow positively, he makes us grow in the community, and he helps us not to fall prey to self-centeredness and one's own way of seeing things. Thus, the Spirit helps us to grow and also to live in community.

LOVE (Heart/ Understanding/Understanding):

Accepting the fruit of DISCERNMENT into our hearts

The Gift of Discernment is cultivated in us most effectively through prayer. Through prayer, we make space so the Spirit can come and help us in that moment, counseling us on what can be done.

SERVE (Hands/ Wisdom/ Will):

Putting our DISCERNMENT in service of the church, humanity, and the world.

This week, look for people the Lord puts in your path with whom you can share, for "As with all of the other gifts of the Spirit, then, counsel, too, constitutes a treasure for the whole Christian community. The Lord does not only speak to us in the intimacy of the heart; yes, he speaks to us, but not only there; he also speaks to us through the voice and witness of the brethren. It is truly a great gift to be able to meet men and women of faith who, especially in the most complicated and important stages of our lives, help us to bring light to our heart and to recognize the Lord's will!" 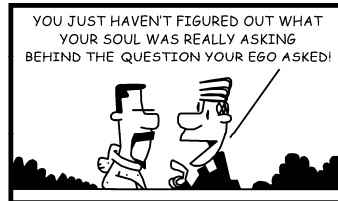

YOU MADE A DIFFERENCE! Justice for Farmworkers!

This winter, on Public Policy Weekend, our parish collected signatures in support of the Farmworkers Fair Labor Practices Act. Over 10,300 signatures were collected around the diocese. We're happy to report that the New York State legislature (finally) passed legislation to give farmworkers basic labor rights, including the right to form a union and bargain collectively and to have one day of rest per week! We had been advocating for farmworkers to get paid overtime as well; the final bill establishes overtime for farmworkers after 60 hours of work a week. This is still not equal with other workers, but it is a step forward. Thank you for standing with our sisters and brothers whose work feeds us.
