Building the Church with the Holy Spirit, Block by Block

Week of August 4

Understanding

"Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." 1 Peter 2:5

This summer we will be reflecting on the various gifts and fruits of the Spirit that build up the Church. Our families received a package of 16 wrapped blocks at our Pentecost Celebration at Myers Park. If you do not have one please take one of the gift bags in the back of the church. Each week, one block will be unwrapped and the gift or the fruit revealed. This week we will unwrap the sixth block you received and find the word **UNDERSTANDING** on it.

Sometime this week, take 15 minutes and either on your own or with your family, and invite the Holy Spirit to come to your household:

Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

After offering this prayer, reflect on the following:

KNOW (Mind/Knowledge/Memory): What is Christian UNDERSTANDING?

The gift of understanding has nothing to do with human intelligence. Instead, it is a grace that the Spirit offers to allow us to go beyond the outward appearance of what is in front of us and search for God's thoughts and plans in a situation. This doesn't mean that we can understand everything and know all of what God plans, but we can understand what we need to when we are in the right relationship with God. Speaking of this gift, Pope Francis said: "This is a beautiful gift that the Lord has given us all. It is the gift with which the Holy Spirit brings us into intimacy with God and makes us part of the plan of love that He is weaving into the plots of our lives and history." LOVE (Heart/ Understanding/ Understanding): Accepting the fruit of UNDERSTANDING into our hearts

The gift of understanding is closely related to faith. When the Holy Spirit dwells in our hearts and enlighten our minds, it makes us grow day by day in the understanding of what the Lord has said and done. One can read the Gospel and understand something, but if we read the Gospel with this gift of the Holy Spirit, we can better understand the depth of God's words. And all we need do is ask: Give us, O Lord, the gift of understanding. The Lord himself has told us that the Holy Spirit would remind us of his teachings and would explain what we do not understand. Through the gift of understanding, the Spirit breaks through the darkness of our minds and our hearts and makes us true believers, able to enjoy what the Lord reveals to us in His Word and rejoice in all that he does in our lives.

SERVE (Hands/ Wisdom/ Will): Putting our UNDERSTANDING in service of the church, humanity, and the world.

Schedule in 15 minutes each day this week to read and pray with Scripture. If you don't know where to start, use the readings of the day which can be found on page five of the bulletin, or at www.usccb.org. Before beginning to read, ask God for the gift of understanding for what you are about to read. After reading through the Scripture a few times, spend a few minutes in silence allowing the Lord to reveal to you what you need to understand in those readings.

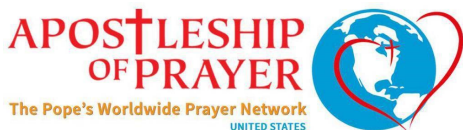
