# Building the Church with the Holy Spirit, Block by Block

## Week of September 15 Gentleness

*“Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.”*

– 1 Peter 2:5

This summer we are reflecting on the various gifts and fruits of the Spirit that build up the Church. Our G.I.F.T. families have received a package of 16 wrapped blocks. Each week, one block is unwrapped and the gift or the fruit revealed. When you unwrap this week's block, you will find the word GENTLENESS on it. Sometime this week, take 15 minutes and either on your own or with your family, and invite the Holy Spirit to come to your household: **Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.**

Then reflect on the following:

**Gentleness** is a strong hand with a soft touch. It is a tender, compassionate approach toward others' weaknesses and limitations. A gentle person still speaks truth, sometimes even painful truth, but in doing so,

guards his tone so the truth can be well received. The Bible goes out of its way to demonstrate Jesus' gentleness. In fact, the Old Testament depicts the Messiah as unusually gentle, telling us that Jesus would not break a “bruised reed” or snuff out a “smoldering wick” (Isaiah 42:3). In the Gospels, Jesus affirmed his gentleness: “I am gentle and humble in heart” (Matthew 11:29). And the apostles often reminded the early church of Jesus' gentleness: “By the meekness and gentleness of Christ, I appeal to you” (2 Corinthians 10:1). Is the fruit of gentleness growing in your life?

Gentleness self-examination questionnaire:

- Was I gentle in the situations I faced today? If not, why?
- Do I exhibit the same gentleness to others that God exhibits to me every day? How?
- Do people describe me as gentle? Or do they describe me as critical or brash? Why?

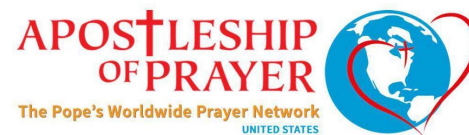
