A Note from Father Daniel

“Come aside and rest awhile”

- Our Lord's words to his disciples

The Code of Canon Law in 276 states,

§1 Clerics have a special obligation to seek holiness in their lives, because they are consecrated to God by a new title through the reception of orders, and are stewards of the mysteries of God in the service of His people.

§2 In order that they can pursue this perfection: 1° they are in the first place faithfully and untiringly to fulfil the obligations of their pastoral ministry; 2° they are to nourish their spiritual life at the twofold table of the sacred Scripture and the Eucharist; priests are therefore earnestly invited to offer the Eucharistic Sacrifice daily; 3° priests, are obliged to carry out the liturgy of the hours daily, in accordance with their own approved liturgical books; 4° they are also obliged to make spiritual retreats, in accordance with the provision of particular law; 5° they are exhorted to engage regularly in mental prayer, to approach the sacrament of penance frequently, to honor the Virgin Mother of God with particular veneration, and to use other general and special means to holiness.

In accordance with the fourth point above, this week, Monday through Friday I will be going on retreat.

In our diocese we are blessed with the presence of religious communities and monasteries. One of our monasteries is Mount Saviour, a community of monks striving to live a simple, genuine and full monastic life according to the Scriptures and the Rule of St. Benedict. Hospitality is a very important part of the rule of Saint Benedict, which in Chapter 53, says:

1) All guests who present themselves are to be welcomed as Christ, for he himself will say: I was a stranger and you welcomed me (Matt 25:35). 2) Proper honor must be shown to all, especially to those who share our faith (Gal 6:10) and to pilgrims. 3) Once a guest has been announced, the superior and the brothers are to meet him with all the courtesy of love. 4) First of all, they are to pray together and thus be united in peace, 5) but prayer must always precede the kiss of peace because of the delusions of the devil. 6) All humility should be shown in addressing a guest on arrival or departure. 7) By a bow of the head or by a complete prostration of the body, Christ is to be adored because he is indeed welcomed in them. 8) After the guests have been received, they should be invited to pray; then the superior or an appointed brother will sit with them. 9) The

divine law is read to the guest for his instruction, and after that every kindness is shown to him. 10) The superior may break his fast for the sake of a guest, unless it is a day of special fast which cannot be broken. 11) The brothers, however, observe the usual fast. 12) The abbot shall pour water on the hands of the guests, 13) and the abbot with the entire community shall wash their feet. 14) After the washing they will recite this verse: God, we have received your mercy in the midst of your temple (Ps. 47 [48]:10). 15) Great care and concern are to be shown in receiving poor people and pilgrims, because in them more particularly Christ is received; our very awe of the rich guarantees them special respect. Following in this tradition of hospitality, Mount Saviour, has several guest houses where they welcome guests and providing them: for a couple of days, a week to be in a quiet place in the country to stay, eat and sleep, to make their own personal retreat, and have an opportunity to pray with the monks as they pray.

Mount Saviour is very close to us, in Pine City, NY just 52 miles from Holy Cross, about a 65 minute drive.

While I am away this week there will be no Masses or confessions. I will be holding all of you in prayer and ask that you kindly pray for me.

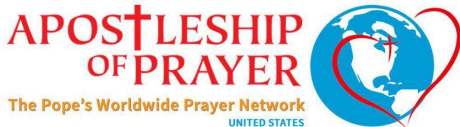

Respect Life Month: Racism is a Life Issue

As we begin Respect Life Month, our Diocesan Public Policy Committee asks us to reflect on the US Bishops' recent pastoral letter on racism entitled *Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love*. In it they write, "The injustice and harm racism causes are an attack on human life. The Church in the United States has spoken out consistently and forcefully against abortion, assisted suicide, euthanasia, the death penalty, and other forms of violence that threaten human life. It is not a secret that these attacks on human life have severely affected people of color, who are disproportionately affected by poverty, targeted for abortion, have less access to healthcare, have the greatest numbers on death row, and are most likely to feel pressure to end their lives when facing serious illness. As bishops, we unequivocally state that racism is a life issue."
