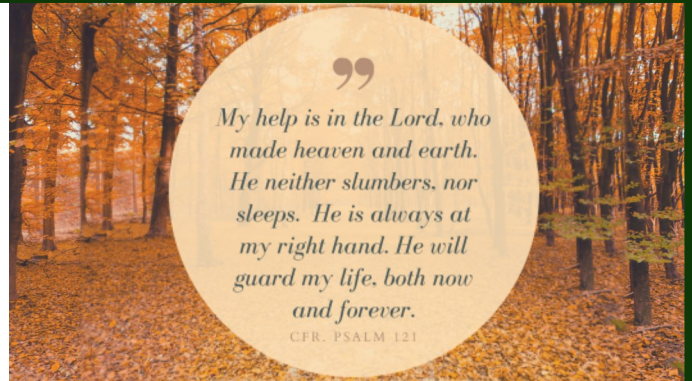

A Note from Father Daniel

Our Eucharistic and Risen Lord unites us in one big family

We might still be trying to get back to our routine after the summer, yet Christmas decorations have already started to show up in the stores. This year is swiftly approaching the end and soon we will start planning for our Thanksgiving dinners, our Christmas parties and all that comes with the holidays.

Before we celebrate all these wonderful gatherings in which we are reminded of the value of family and friends, we will have the opportunity to celebrate two very special days which remind us of the presence and love of our bigger Catholic family.

On November 1, we will celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, which reminds us that we are part of a community of love, which we call Church, a communion of Saints. Those of us in this world, saints through the blood of Christ, doing our best to live in a way that corresponds with this grace of holiness that we received through Baptism, and those that have gone to the Lord and now enjoy of the fullness of life and holiness.

In our Catholic church family we have over 12,000 recognized Saints, all of whom we properly call sisters and brothers, all of whom join us every time that we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, all of whom “spend their heaven, doing good on earth” (Saint Thérèse of Lisieux). What a tremendous gift it is to think that at all times we have 12,000 saints that love us, invested in praying for us, caring for us, guiding us. That every time we wonder as to what is the proper way to live, we can read the lives of any of these 12,000 sisters and brothers and find sound wisdom as to how we can encounter the joy of service and live the best life.

Throughout the months of October and November we have a lot planned to help us all become aware of this gift of the Saints: 1) we will have our Masses for the Solemnity of All Saints, 2) On Sunday, October 20th, for our 4:30 pm G.I.F.T. Mass we will be displaying for veneration 21 relics of Saints and a relic of the Cross, at **All Saints Parish**, 3) on Saturday October 26 we will be displaying for veneration 14 relics of Saints and a relic of the Cross at **Saint Anthony Parish**, which will remain in the church for permanent veneration for

years to come and you can visit them on Tuesdays and Fridays 8:30 am – 4:30 pm when the church is open. 4) On Saturday, November 16, Fr. Patrick Tobin, O.P. from the Dominican Shrine of St. Jude Thaddeus will come to **Holy Cross Parish** with their relic of Saint Jude, Apostle for a rosary, Mass, veneration of the relic, and anointing with St. Jude oil.

If you do not even know what relics are, or wonder why we offer them veneration, or find the whole thing a little strange, stay tuned and attend the above-mentioned events to learn more. **May God be praised, in all his saints!**

On November 2, we will celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. By this celebration we are invited to remember that in Christ we are not only united to the Saints, we are also always united to all those who have gone before us. We are invited to remember our deceased loved ones and to pray for them.

During the entire month of November, our **Book of Remembrance** will be placed next to the Paschal Candle, which reminds us of our hope in the Resurrection. You are invited to write the names of your loved ones in the book at any point during the month. We will be praying for those inscribed in the book at all of our Masses. This year we will be celebrating our special **Masses of Remembrance** on **Saturday, November 2 at 4:30 pm at Saint Anthony, Sunday, November 3, at 8:30 am at Holy Cross, and Sunday, November 3 at 10:30 am at All Saints**. You can find forms at the entrance of church where you can write the names of your deceased loved ones that you want us to name and light candles for during our remembrance Masses. A reception will follow each of these Masses. Please join us and invite others to join us. All are welcome.

May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace!

May these experiences help us to feel very near to our Saints and to our loved ones who have gone before us, may we never feel alone, may we always be deeply aware that we belong, that we are loved and cared for.

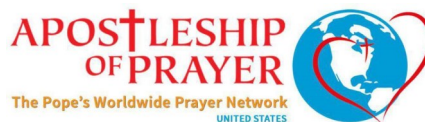
