Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is available for individuals upon request, and communal celebrations are scheduled each month at the Groton Nursing Home and on once a year on Holy Thursday morning.

A Note from Father Daniel

On November 2nd, we will celebrate **The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed**, more commonly known as the feast of All Souls. This is a time in which we remember our deceased loved ones and all the deceased. This is also a time at which we are reminded that in Christ all the baptized, on earth, in heaven and in purgatory are part of one family, which we call the Communion of Saints. Those in heaven intercede for us, and we offer prayers, Masses and sacrifices for those in purgatory and in this way we are all united in solidarity in our path to salvation.

Because we are all united and co-responsible for each other, we have clear duties to the dead which are clearly formulated in the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Our spiritual responsibility towards the dead is to pray for them. Our corporal responsibility towards the dead is to bury them properly and to care for their graves.

In this coming month of November, I encourage all to offer prayers for the dead, those they knew and love and those that might have no one to pray for them. You might even visit one of our cemeteries and pray for those buried there. You might also want to consider offering a Mass intention, a sanctuary candle or the altar bread and wine for the dead.

This month I also invite you to consider if you can volunteer to help us take care of our cemeteries and if you can please talk to me.

Our parishes are blessed to have the opportunity to fulfill our duty to bury the dead and care for their graves through our two cemeteries: Saint Anthony in Groton and Saint Patrick in McLean.


This month is also a good time to consider our own mortality, to be reminded that our existence, through God's grace and Jesus loving sacrifice, will extend into eternity beyond our short journey here and to plan for our final place of rest, preferably on consecrated ground in a Catholic Cemetery.

Saint Anthony Cemetery has full plots available at \$800, if you decide to purchase a plot between November 1 and November 30 this year that cost will be only \$750. In the near future we plan to open a new section for green burial. If you would be interested in this option please let the parish office know, this will help us plan ahead.

Saint Patrick Cemetery in McLean, which was established in 1851, has 150 cremains plots available. Small plots for burial of cremains without a vault are only \$250 during the month of November. Cremains plots that are big enough for a vault will be only \$300 during November.

Our cemeteries are open to all Catholics and their family members that have been baptized.

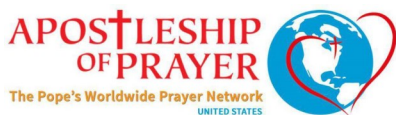
