## A Note from Father Daniel

### Our Sisters and Brothers the Saints

In times when the newspapers sadly remind us everyday of how some men and women who belonged to the church used their religious status and their bodies to become instruments of evil and inflict horrible harm on God's children through abuse, and we might be tempted to despair of the construct of the church as a whole, it will be good for us to remember all the awesome human beings that this same church has produced along the centuries in the persons of the saints.

The church can be a beautiful and effective instrument of salvation and produce good and holy women and men, or like most things we can use it for harm. We will never apologize sufficiently for the harm we have caused, and we must always remain vigilant so that the church is never used in any way as an instrument of evil and so that we do not use our religious practices and structures to become comfortable in our sins, and cover them up becoming whitewashed tombs.

As we remember the saints this month we should first, entrust our brothers and sisters who have survived abuse to their prayers, that they might find justice, healing and peace. We should also allow the lives of the saints to heal us, nourish us and encourage us as we strive to remain faithful to Our Lord, in His Church and to lead holy lives.

This month in each of our churches we have offered relics of saints for public veneration. 14 in permanent display at Saint Anthony, 14 in temporary display at All Saints (eventually to remain there in permanent display), and 7 in permanent display at Holy Cross. These relics are all first class relics, which means that they are parts of the physical remains of the saints. Relics have been part of the Christian tradition since New Testament times when objects touched to the apostles were then brought to the sick for their healing, etc.

This practice of keeping and venerating relics of saints is good for us, and contributes to good theology in many ways, here are 7 of those:

1. It reminds us that we are one family with the saints and that they are always interceding for us. Being able to venerate their relics, makes us aware of their closeness to us. We keep their relics in the same way that we keep family pictures, heirlooms, etc. The saints are our family.
2. This practice follows from the logic of our sacramental economy. God in God's love, mercy and patience with humanity and understanding that we come to knowledge and understanding through our senses has provided us with things we can touch, see, smell, hear, taste as instruments to experience the divine. These elements are the fabric of our sacramental celebrations and this same principle holds true when it comes to relics, which we can see and touch. The spiritual is made visible to us in the material.
3. The practice of keeping and venerating the physical remains of the saints reminds us of the sacredness of the human body. Not just as a vessel for the soul, or a sinful hindrance, but as an integral part of who we are as created by God, that is to be cherished and honored.

4. The reality of relics being able to bring people closer to the saints and to God and in many cases to mediate healing, should speak volumes to us regarding the power of grace to transform us fully into instruments of God's love. Every little part of our being, body, soul and spirit can be transformed by God's power into blessing for us and others. We should all find great hope in this.
5. This practice of keeping and venerating relics is a way to affirm our belief in the resurrection of the Body. Relics prefigure the power of our glorified bodies to advance the Kingdom of God.
6. Relics, should prevent us from forming idealized images of the saints, as if they were angels. As we venerate their very flesh, we are reminded that they were human just like us, make of the same clay and if they were able to be true disciples of Jesus Christ, we can too.
7. The veneration of relics should also guard us from any magical understanding of God, reminding us that God works through Incarnation, this is by taking on human flesh, by becoming present in our history through human beings and not through magical acts. Our God works through patriarchs and prophets, saints and more than anything through Jesus Christ, whom we eat in the Most Holy Eucharist and whom we are called to become. Our God, wants to work through each one of us, our choices either evil into this world or make present the face of the merciful Father.

In addition to all the relics we are already offering for veneration in our churches, this month we will have a very special event, on Saturday, November 16, Fr. Patrick Tobin, O.P. will visit Holy Cross bringing with him the forearm of Saint Jude Apostle. This is the largest relic of the Apostle outside of Europe. To think that this arm once might have held onto Our Lord; that this arm was used to baptize many at our Savior's command, go and baptize all nations; that this arm blessed so many, as the Apostle brought the Gospel to Lebanon... what a tremendous gift to have one of the apostles among us in this way!!!

Fr. Tobin will lead us in the Rosary, preside and preach at Mass and then offer the relic for veneration as well as anointing with Saint Jude's oil. Do not miss this opportunity. Join us Saturday, November 16, at 10 am at Holy Cross, Freeville. All are welcome!

May the saints intercede for us so that we may all come closer to God and make the church a true instrument of salvation, the loving presence of Christ in a broken world.

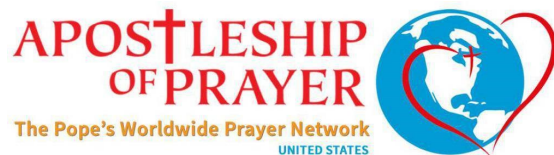
