## A Note from Deacon George

Deacons are required to pray daily the Liturgy of the Hours. The Liturgy of the Hours is, also, known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (*Opus Dei*). It is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day and sanctifying the day with prayer. The Hours are a meditative dialogue on the mystery of Christ, using scripture and prayer.

There are five canonical hours: the Office of Readings, Morning Prayer, Daytime Prayer, Evening Prayer, and Night Prayer. Deacons are required to do two, the Morning and Evening Prayer, but at times I will do one or more of the other hours. These prayers are made up on the Psalms, and readings from for the New Testament and sections of the Gospels.

The Liturgy of the Hours is open to all of the faithful, and is a wonderful way for us to meditate on our dependence of God and on the blessing that He bestows on us, but also, since these are readings from the Bible, these are the Word of God, and can speak to us in our time of need.

I recall one time when I was visiting my father-in-law who had suffered multiple strokes and had trouble speaking and communicating with people. It was evening, and I was praying the Night Prayer out loud. In it, was Psalm 88:

**“Lord my God, I call for help by day;  
I cry at night before you.  
Let my prayer come into your presence.  
O turn your ear to my cry.  
For my soul is filled with evils;  
My life is on the brink of the grave...”**

To my amazement, I found my father-in-law praying along with me... repeating my words.

These words of prayer are powerful and important.

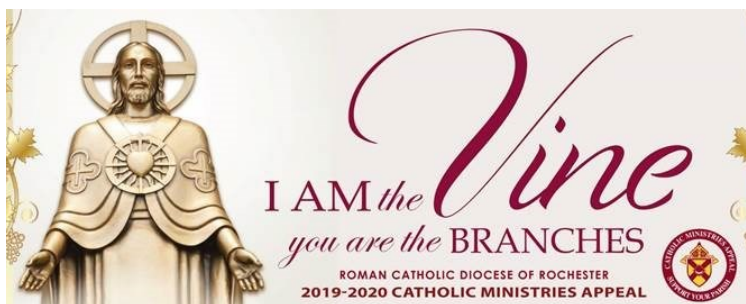

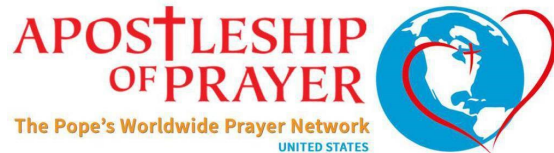
