Updates regarding staff and Thank you to Emmanuel

Many of you may already be aware of this fact – Emmanuel received a very generous offer from the University of Pittsburgh to pursue a Ph.D. in Music Composition, which he has accepted. This means that he will no longer serve us as Administrative Assistant and Music Minister at N.E.T. Catholic, effective Friday, August 7th.

Earlier this year, I was thinking that we won't have any more changes. It seems in the past few years, we have had the comings and goings of many staff persons. Then, coronavirus hit and brought with it the departure of many more members of our staff. To them I extended my gratitude and my regret in having to let them go at that time, and now I want to once again on behalf of our three parish communities say thank you to all our staff members that were let go in March for their many years of dedicated service to our parishes in different roles and to assure them of our prayers and our best wishes for the next chapter in their lives.

Recently, even though the low income levels of All Saints Parish, do not really allow it, we have rehired Julia Phillips because we simply cannot continue to have liturgies without music. It is my hope that All Saints Parishioners will increase their level of giving so we can afford at least the mere essentials. We will see how this goes. Given the financial constraints of All Saints Parish and the uncertainty of the coming year or two due to the ongoing pandemic we do not foresee rehiring anyone else. If we do not have volunteers step up at All Saints and Holy Cross (Saint Anthony is fully covered by three amazing and extremely generous volunteers that take care of all building needs, cleaning and disinfecting, gardens and church environment needs) we will have to further jeopardize the financial stability of the parishes by seeking to hire a shared person to take care of cleaning and disinfecting. I still have some hope in our people, so I will give this some time, and not make a decision regarding this until August 7th at which point if we need to move forward we will seek to hire a shared person to clean the 3 parishes beginning September 8th.

Since Emmanuel shared his news with us a few weeks ago, Dawn and I have been discussing if it would be possible for us to take on the responsibilities of Manny's job so we do not have to hire someone new and we can save the parishes some money. These past couple weeks in which we have again been driving around to the three parishes have been a good reminder of how extremely time consuming this driving around is and how much time goes into reorienting ourselves in each place and adapting to the particular culture and demands of each parish and we have concluded that it is not realistic to think that in addition to all that we are doing we could also absorb the Administrative Assistant's responsibilities.

A year ago some had doubts that a shared Admin Assistant would work. This change allowed us to standardize and simplify processes across the three parishes and to go from paying a total of 60 hours a week for this job to paying 35 hours a week. This change also allowed us to hire someone full time, pay a

living wage and offer benefits, which is the right thing to do. This is also what allowed us to keep Emmanuel through the crisis and to obtain some federal assistance to cover 8 weeks of his salary. In the set up we had before with part-time parish secretaries none of this would have been possible.

Because Emmanuel has done such a great job I hope that there is no doubt in anyone's mind at this point that this kind of set up works. Emmanuel has been great at streaming processes and bringing things up to date, which will allow us to further reduce this job to 25 hours a week, while continuing to pay a living wage and offer benefits. This week Emmanuel, Dawn and I are working on the Job Description so that we can start looking for someone. We will be posting the offering June 25th and hoping to find someone to start July 28.

Needless-to-say, I am sad that Emmanuel will be leaving us. Generously, he has stepped up to serve the people of these parishes in many ways. And, he has done it with a smile and a gentleness that more than accomplished each task. I am grateful to God that we have had the opportunity to work together and am equally grateful that we had such a servant present in our community. He is a man of prayer, a thoughtful individual whose work reflected his deep concern for others and his awareness of God's call to love one another. He brought a rich sense of love to the people he assisted and served.

Emmanuel has a wonderful sense of humor and the ability to be comfortable in any group he finds himself. There is a gentleness to his listening ears that allowed many to build a relationship with him in these short months.

Through these very stressful months of the pandemic, Emmanuel did not hesitate to share his musical talent with us, which I know became an oasis in our day for so many of us. Maybe in the future he will be able to visit and play for us.

On behalf of our parishes, I want to extend your gracious thanks to Emmanuel for his year of service to our community. I know that I can assure him of your continued prayers as he continues his academic formation in another state. I am not sure how we might honor him, as social gatherings still are not supported as we struggle to re-open and establish a bit of normalcy to our liturgical celebrations and parish life while trying to stop the spread of the coronavirus. I do promise you that when something is finally planned – you will be informed and will then be able to express your own thanks to Emmanuel face-to-face, in the meantime I would encourage you to send him a card which you can mail to Holy Cross Parish. We offer thanks to God for His goodness in bringing Emmanuel here and His divine guidance in all that Emmanuel's service has brought to us. We wish Emmanuel the very best in this new stage of his journey and hope that Jesus will continue to shape his heart after His Most Sacred Heart for the service of his people and the glory of God.

A few reminders on our operations between June 16 and September 7, 2020

- All **parish events and meetings** other than Mass are cancelled during this time period.
- Our churches remain open for **private individual prayer** 8 am—8 pm all days of the week that there is no Mass at a given church. They are closed on days we have Mass to allow for cleaning and disinfecting.
- You can request **Mass intentions** by calling the office Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday 9 am—4 pm, or by emailing Emmanuel (emmanuel.berrido@dor.org). Donations for Mass intentions can be made online or mailed to each parish.
- **Rice bowls:** For those of you that took Rice Bowls at the beginning of Lent, please bring them back if you come to Mass. Do not drop them off at the church at other times, the churches are always open and they can be stolen. You can also drop them off at the office once we reopen June 30. We need all rice bowls back by July 13.
- During this time period our churches are functioning at **social distance capacity** for Masses, Funerals, Weddings, Baptisms, etc.: 65 at Saint Anthony, 75 at Holy Cross and 85 at All Saints.
- We have modified our **Mass schedule** (see page 1 and 4 of this bulletin) so that all have an opportunity to attend Sunday Mass every week. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains lifted and if you feel unsafe please stay home and take advantage of our continued livestreaming of all Masses and all devotions. If you feel safe and have otherwise been leaving your home for social gatherings, or going places other than the doctor or the grocery store than you should be coming to Mass every Sunday.
- Please note that even as the ecclesiastical discipline of the Sunday obligation might be dispensed for the time being, the divine law expressed in the third commandment: “Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day” cannot be dispensed. This means that the wisdom behind the Sunday Obligation remains operative. We need to rest, we need to dedicate time to the Lord, we need to attend to our spiritual life, so please be very intent in doing that and take advantage of the 27 opportunities for that we offer each week online and in person, such as Sunday and Weekday Masses, Adoration and Benediction, Music moments to start and end your day, Growing with Dawn, Marian Devotions and Devotion to the Sacred Heart (see page 4 of this bulletin).
- To prevent having to turn people away at the door, in person **attendance at Mass is by sign up only**. To sign up you can go online (we email out the sign up link every Friday and post it on our Facebook daily) or you can call the office at (607) 241- 0821 Tuesday-Wednesday-Thursday 9 am-4 pm.
- As explained in previous weeks, much will be different when you come to Mass. Here are a few reminders (for the complete information please refer to previous communications):
- You will be required to wear a **mask** from the moment you leave your car until you have returned to your car • **Restrooms** and crying rooms will not be available • There will be no coffee hours or congregations of people of any kind before or after Mass • When you arrive you might have to wait at the door, yellow lines on the sidewalk will help you maintain social distance • Once you come in we ask that you **sanitize** your hands • You will be provided with a one use only **worship aid** that we ask you either take home or put in the recycling bin on your way out. • You will be **ushered** to a specific seat, we will seat people from front to back, preserving 6 feet distance between those that do not live together. We ask for especial flexibility and responsibility with this. You will likely not end up seating where you usually do. Please be very careful to keep **six feet distance** at all times from all who do not live with you. • Once all on the list have been seated or once it is time to begin Mass we will lock the doors to the church. Please make sure to **get to church at least 5 minutes prior** (15 if you can) before the start of Mass. • At Communion time there will be only **one communion station**. We will ask all to remain in their seats. Father will call forward one pew at a time. Please use the yellow lines on the floor to help you maintain 6 feet distance from all that do not live with you. • Once you receive Holy Communion, you will return to your pew as usual. • At the end of Mass, we will once again ask you to stay in your pew, and you will be **ushered out** to make sure that social distance is kept. • There will be **no sign of peace and no holding hands** at any time during the liturgy. • There will be **no collection**, if you want to make a donation to the church and you are not doing it online remember that for visitors and the few that continue to use envelopes for their donations as well as for second collections, maintenance collections, candles and other donations, we now have **one sacrificial offering station in each of our churches, where you can drop in your donations** at any time.
