**ALL SAINTS DAY**

**November 1st** is All Saints Day and a Holy Day of Obligation for all Catholics. On this day we celebrate the Church Triumphant, those men and women who lived a virtuous life or even gave their lives (martyred) rather than deny Christ. A saint is one who has been declared by the Church to be living eternally with God in heaven. The saints are our models and intercede for us in the heavenly court. **The Vigil Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 31st and at 7:00 a.m. on Thursday, November 1st.** All Masses will be celebrated in the Chapel of the Holy Spouses, Mary and Joseph.

**On Friday, November 2nd,** we pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory and we begin our nine day novena for their repose. **Mass will be celebrated at 7:00 a.m.** in the Chapel of the Holy Spouses, Mary and Joseph. ### November - First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

**Friday, November 2nd** is the First Friday of the month. Traditionally in our parish every First Friday of the month is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Our day begins with the celebration of **Mass at 7AM** in the Chapel of the Holy Spouses, Mary and Joseph, followed by **Exposition and Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament until 12 Noon. At Noon, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament is given.** The rosary is prayed every hour on the half hour beginning at **7:30 AM**. All are invited to come anytime during these hours for spiritual enrichment and personal time with Jesus. **We encourage our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to spend some time in prayer before the REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS** as part of their spiritual development. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus also serves as a reminder for one to receive the Sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation). The Sacrament of Reconciliation may be requested any day, following morning Mass, by coming to the Sacristy. Confession is also available from **8 a.m. to 3 p.m.** each weekday (except Thursday) at the rectory or by appointment. Saturday confessions are scheduled 3-3:30 p.m. in the upper church.

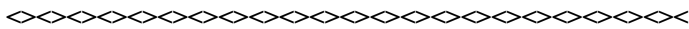

**Veteran's Drive**



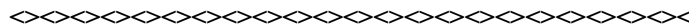
