The rosary is prayed each weekday morning after the 7:00 a.m. Mass. All are welcome.

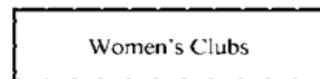


The rectory office will be closed on **Wednesday, November 11th** in observance of the **Veterans Day** .
