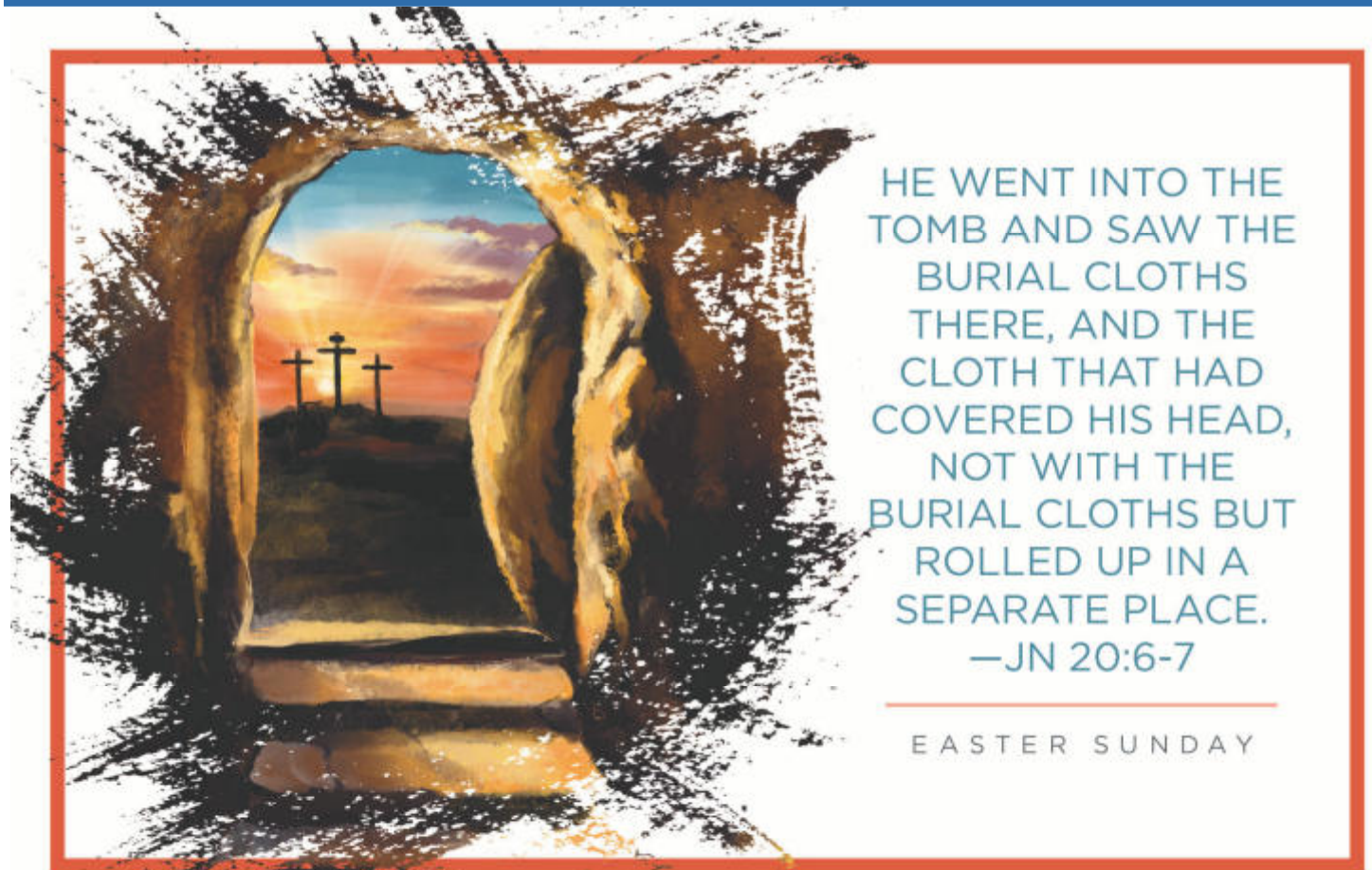

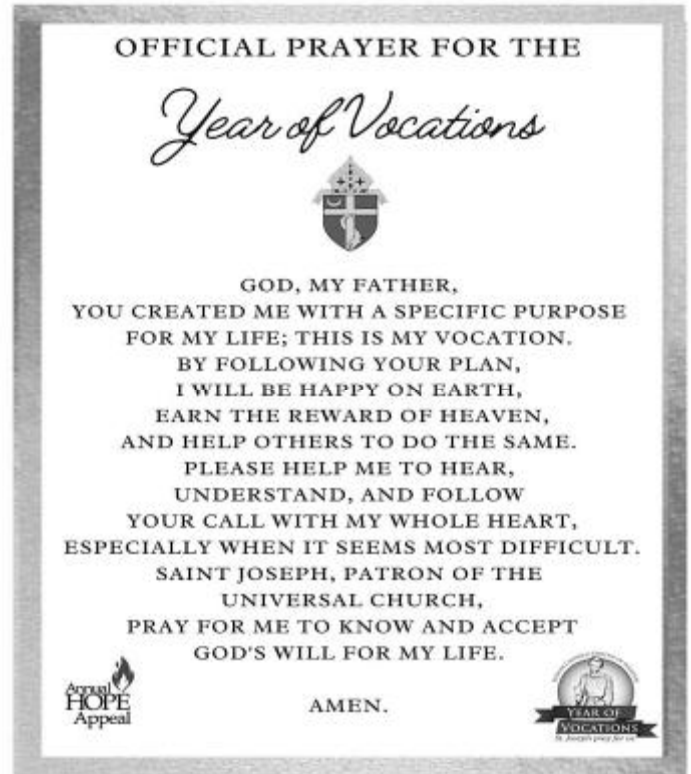


Get Ready for Next Sunday

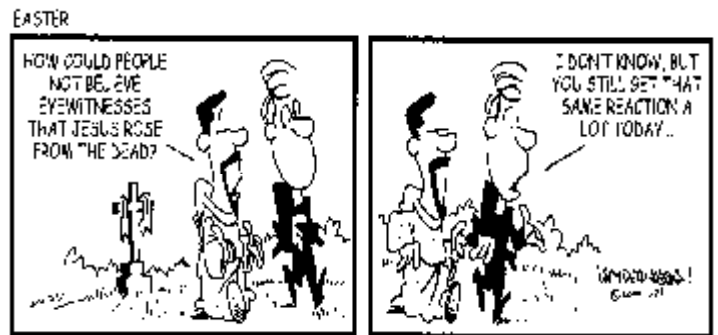

Who Am I? Jesus could describe himself based on all of the same criteria we use for ourselves (i.e. gifts, talents, personality.) After all, Jesus is totally human. PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on June 19, 2020, The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse, New York, (“Diocese”) filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the “Bankruptcy Code”).
