**Encountering Jesus** – How can we have a personal encounter with Jesus in the Sacraments? Let's continue with **Reconciliation**. Did you know there are three names for this sacrament? Confession, Penance, and Reconciliation. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we confess our sins to a priest, we receive a penance to show God we are sorry for our sins, and we are reconciled with God and our neighbor. The priest absolves our sins in *persona Christi* – the person of Christ – meaning the priest cannot forgive our sins, but only as the person of Christ, does he absolve our sins in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Next week, the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

**Food Drive** – Oct. 1-Nov. 1 – Most needed items are peanut butter, jelly, canned vegetables, and hamburger helper. These will be going to St. Joseph Food Program where they serve over 1000 families per week. Thank you for your donations.
