

Please be aware:



One of our parishioners here at Saint Anthony's was recently made the target of a phone scam. She received a call/text that was made to look like it was from me as the pastor essentially asking for her to give money so I could help someone in need. Thankfully, she was suspicious about it and we got the police involved. Please note that I would never solicit money or ask for assistance through text or a phone call. If I ever needed your help to support a person or family in need it would be done through official and public channels (bulletin, announcements at Mass, parish mailing that can be authenticated by a phone call to the parish, and/or Archdiocesan Flock Notes) on behalf of St. Anthony's Parish or in person. As a reminder and caution, never respond to or give any money to anyone who approaches you through texting, email, or over the phone even if a familiar name is used. Make it a strict policy to always verify that the person really is who they say they are by calling the family member or person you believe is trying to contact you by using the contact information YOU have and not the contact information the scammer has given you to use. How sad that there are people trying to take advantage of people's goodness. They would be much better off praying to God than preying on other people. In turn, let us pray for those who prey on us.

“Remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know from whom you have learned it, and from infancy you have known the sacred scriptures, which are capable of giving you wisdom for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scriptures is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction and for training in righteousness, so that those who belong to Jesus may be competent, equipped for every good work.”

When is the last time you opened your bible at home, or listened with great attention as the scriptures were proclaimed at mass? When did you reflect on God’s word, during the week after hearing it at liturgy, or heard a text which was familiar to you? When did you think it might be helpful to attend a bible study?

The words above which Paul wrote to Timothy are invitations to us, so we can grow in our faith. The teaching reminds us of growing after first communion, confirmation or our marriage. We continue to grow older, are we growing in holiness? Pope Francis’ exhortation offers us the beatitudes as the path for holiness. The bible in your living room has allergies. It is allergic to dust. Please open it read it and heed it!

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.
