

#### Gospel Today


Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time | Matthew 25:1-13

Of the 10 bridesmaids in the parable, 5 brought enough oil for their lamps for a long wait. The other 5 were not prepared and when their oil ran out, they missed the bridegroom when they went back for more oil. Always be prepared, like the 5 sensible bridesmaids. We never know the day or hour when Christ will return.

Year A

There are 10 dots to follow, like the 10 bridesmaids waiting for the bridegroom.

Connect the dots - be wise, like the 5 prepared bridesmaids with a full lamp of oil, then color your lamp.

“We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep... Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour.”

In our tradition, we remember this month the holy souls. We profess our part in the communion of saints. Last week was All Saints day. We direct our prayer to those awaiting entrance into glory and those who live with the Lord. We who live our faith, pray for others and ask the saints to intercede for us.

During this calendar year, constantly reminded of the coronavirus, we have reason to pray for the thousands caught in the web which trapped us. Paul did not say we cannot grieve, but we grieve with hope, aware of the promise which Jesus has made for us. The events of the past year are a ‘wake up call’ to live the life of grace, seek forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, to put our lives in order. If away from confession and the sacraments for a time, know that this is the moment.

How many called home to the Lord this year, never considered how close was the Lord to their final meeting? Act upon the word today.

## Believe in Jesus

### **First Reading: Wisdom 6:12-16**

Regarded as personifying God’s power, Wisdom is readily and easily found by those who seek her.

### **Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18**

The Thessalonians, who fear that those who have died will miss Christ’s return, are comforted by Paul’s assurance that those “who have died in Christ will rise first.”

### **Gospel: Matthew 25:1-13**

In the parable of the five sensible bridesmaids and the five foolish bridesmaids, Jesus emphasizes the fact that we must always be ready for the coming of Christ because in his words, “You know not the day or the hour.”
