St. Anthony S.T.A.R.S.

The Students of the STARS program review the Sunday Gospel and reflect on the Transfiguration of Jesus. 1st graders word of the week is “Heaven”. They are learning that Jesus invites us to change and grow. 2nd and 3rd graders word for the week is “Transfiguration” and are learning the many roles of Jesus as healer, teacher, and Son of God. 4th through 6th graders are reviewing the Covenant God made with Moses and the gift of the 10 Commandments which is their word of the week. 7th graders are reviewing the Death and Resurrections of Jesus. 8th graders are continuing with the “Gifted with the Holy Spirit” work book and learning how to recognize the Holy Spirit in their lives.



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence from meat.

FASTING: Prescribes that only one full meal a day be taken. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength; but these taken together should not equal another full meal.

ABSTINENCE: Forbids the eating of meat.

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

There is a serious obligation to observe these penitential practices in a substantial way. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from Fast and Abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause or excuse.

STATIONS of the CROSS

Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday during Lent at 7:00pm followed by Mass at 7:30pm and a Holy Hour with confessions from 8pm – 9pm.





“Jesus answered and said to her, ‘If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, ‘Give me a drink’, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water... Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst. The water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.”

Do yourself a favor. Open your bible to chapter 4 of John’s gospel and live the scene of Jesus and the Samaritan woman. Discover the gentle invitation of Jesus, opening her heart to what He wanted for her.

Listen closely to the conversation, perhaps her initial fear, a stranger violating the customary protocol, and gradually she discovers herself, and Christ. ‘Come and see a man who has told me everything I have done.’

May the living water, God’s grace this Lent well up in me, bringing forgiveness in reconciliation, and strength in the Eucharist.

First Reading: Exodus 20:1-17

Through Moses, God passed on the commandments he wished all people to follow. He tells us not to worship idols or take the name of the Lord in vain. All the laws God gave to us, if followed, would ensure that we could live in peace and harmony with one another as he had planned.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

Paul tells the Corinthians that Christ is the power and the wisdom of God. Although they claimed to possess wisdom, “God’s folly is wiser than men, and his weakness is more powerful than men.”

Gospel: John 2:13-25

Jesus went to the temple of Jerusalem to find merchants there selling sheep and doves. He knocked over their tables and drove the animals away. The merchants asked him for a sign that he was authorized to do this. He told them to “destroy this temple (referring to his body) and in three days I will raise it up.” The merchants misunderstood, and did not believe he could rebuild in three days what had taken nearly 50 years to build. Still many believed in him, after seeing the miracles he had performed.
