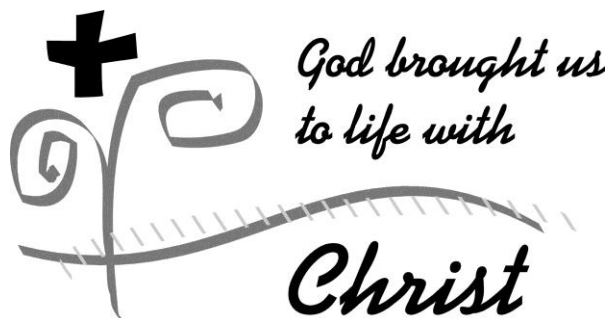

St. Anthony S.T.A.R.S.

The Students of the STARS program review the Sunday Gospels important message that Jesus' sacrifice of dying on the cross is remembered at every Mass. 1st graders word of the week is "Church" and they are learning about Saints that help us grow like Jesus. 2nd and 3rd graders' word for the week is "Sacrifice". They are learning the sacrifice that Jesus made by dying on the cross for us. 4th through 6th graders are reviewing the meaning of the Lord's prayer. 7th graders are continuing to learn about Jesus through baptism and temptation. 8th graders are continuing with the "Gifted with the Holy Spirit" workbook and recognizing the gifts of the Holy Spirit in themselves.

Palm Crosses are \$10.00

Please don't wait till the weekend to purchase palm crosses as we usually run out before Sunday Mass.



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence from meat.

FASTING: Prescribes that only one full meal a day be taken. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength; but these taken together should not equal another full meal.

ABSTINENCE: Forbids the eating of meat. *Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.*

There is a serious obligation to observe these penitential practices in a substantial way. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from Fast and Abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause or excuse.



STATIONS of the CROSS

Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday during Lent at 7:00pm followed by Mass at 7:30pm and a Holy Hour with confessions from 8pm – 9pm.

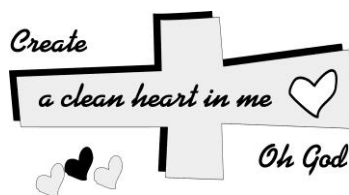

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

The Lord comforted his people, who were exiled to Babylon, by telling them of the new covenant he planned to make with them. The Lord declared he would write his law upon their hearts, and that he would forgive their evil and forget the sins they had committed in the past.

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9

Though God could have heeded his Son’s prayers and spared him suffering, Jesus accepted his Father’s will. Through his suffering, he learned obedience and became the source of eternal salvation for all people.

Gospel: John 12:20-33
