Before registering for Sunday Mass, or considering attending a weekday Mass, everyone is to please read the Updated Vs 4.1 "Welcome Back to The Good Shepherd Church!" document, found on our homepage. This document details all information you need to follow when attending any Mass at our church during these days of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Dear Parishioners of The Good Shepherd Parish,

As we slowly emerge from the COVID-19 lockdown, it is with great joy that we have begun holding two daily Masses per week. This past week we held a 9:00 am Mass on Tuesday and on Friday. Both of these Masses went very smoothly. The small number attending, followed the protocols we have in place (see page two of this bulletin: Weekday Masses) and so we will continue with this twice per week schedule. As noted, we are unable to hold more weekday Masses due to COVID-19 requirements to clean between Masses.

As a reminder for all weekend Sunday Masses, attendees are required to register on our parish homepage. If you know of someone who has no internet access, please ask them to telephone the parish office and leave a message with Bonnie Kobner, our Parish Secretary; she will enter the registration for them. Registration for a Sunday Mass, on the parish website, is available from Sunday evening up until noon the following Saturday.

I share with you some news regarding our Archbishop: the Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, the Most Reverend Luigi Bonazzi, will confer the Pallium (a liturgical vestment that symbolizes the jurisdiction of the Archbishop) on the recently appointed Metropolitan Archbishop of Ottawa-Cornwall, the Most Reverend Terrence Prendergast, S.J., during a Eucharistic celebration on Friday 31 July 2020, at Notre Dame Cathedral Basilica (Ottawa), at 12:15 p.m. While Archbishop Prendergast's retirement will be occurring at a date, yet to be determined, let us pray for him as he continues his faithful service to the people of the newly formed Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall. As you all know, the Most Reverend Marcel Damphousse, Coadjutor Archbishop has been appointed as Archbishop Prendergast's successor and I invite everyone to pray for him as he prepares to assume the mantle of pastoral leadership here in the Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall.

You are all requested to please follow our parish COVID-19 protocols:

- wear your mask; no gloves when receiving Holy Communion
- enter Church by the Main/Front door
- on arrival, use the touchless hand sanitizer on the wall
- take a seat in the Main Worship Space, ensuring social distancing between you and others who are not in your group
- please depart the Church immediately following conclusion of Mass, ensuring social distancing is maintained at all times
- depart Church by the side door (down cloakroom hallway)
