Hafa Adai Parents and Guardians,

We hope all is well with your families. We have opened the school year and we are excited to be on campus with the students.

While we are maintaining protocols of wearing masks, washing hands, and social distancing, we remain vigilant as COVID-19 is not completely gone from our island.

We have been notified of one individual who tested positive from our school community. The student has not been on campus since Friday, August 13th. Mr. Quitugua and I were informed today and have initiated the required protocols in line with the Department of Public Health and Social Services. There is no reason to believe that COVID-19 was contracted from the student's time on campus at SFCS.

In direct communication with our liaison with the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) we enacted the following:

1. The individual who tested positive has not been on campus since last week and is currently in isolation. The student may return upon receiving a negative test result and documentation from DPHSS.
2. Close contacts were identified through seating charts and interviews. Close contacts are individuals who were within six feet for 15 minutes or more.
3. Close contacts who are not fully vaccinated are able to be tested as soon as today, because the exposure occurred more than five days ago, and if a negative test result is provided, may return to campus as soon as tomorrow.
4. Fully vaccinated close contacts and those who have a documented previous COVID-19 infection (no more than 90 days prior to exposure) and are asymptomatic do not have to quarantine.

Mr. Quitugua, your SFCS family, and I would like to reassure you that all possible measures are in place to limit exposure to the virus on our campus. In our efforts to alleviate apprehension and undue worry, we remain vigilant in following protocols. Lastly, your child's health and well being is first and foremost. Please continue to practice the mandated guidelines and protocols of DPHSS and SFCS.

We will keep you updated accordingly, and we keep you and your families in our prayers.
