RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS

Please note that, although Mass has resumed, **the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect through June 30th.** I encourage anyone over the age of 65, those who have or live with anyone with a health vulnerability, and anyone who is worried that attending Mass would add undue stress or jeopardize their health or the health of a person with whom they live, to remain at home at this time and refrain from attending Mass.

Please note also that it will take some time for our life to return to normal. Our Mass will look and feel different for a while, and we will not be able to resume many of our social and fellowship activities for some time. We will be as careful and health-conscious as possible, and all are encouraged to be cautious and not return to Mass more quickly than is prudent or comfortable for you.
