**What is the Tridium?**

It is the period of 3 days that begins with the liturgy on the evening of the last part of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday & Easter Sunday.

**HOLY THURSDAY:** at evening, begin Easter Tridium of the Lords Solemnity Passion, Death and Resurrection.

**GOOD FRIDAY:** Day of Fasting (ages 18-59) and abstinence from meat (ages 14 and up)

**HOLY SATURDAY:** Also called Black Saturday, is a vigil service that is held after nightfall, or dawn on Easter Sunday.

**EASTER SUNDAY:** The Resurrection of Our Lord And Savior Jesus Christ

**New Changes for Lectors and Deacons**  
Lectors and/or Deacons, when proclaiming the Word of God (Epistles) it is done at the Ambo, all other prayers, i.e., Prayer of the Faithful, Rosary, Announcements, etc., will be read from the Choir-side Podium. This is in keeping with the General Instructions of the Roman Missal implementing Cannon Law taken from Chapter II: Arrangement of the Sanctuary for the Sacred Synaxis (Eucharistic Assembly), The Ambo, #309: "From the Ambo only the readings, the responsorial Psalm, and the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) are to be proclaimed; it may be used also for giving the homily and for announcing the intentions of the Prayer of the Faithful. The dignity of the ambo requires that only one minister of the word should go up." These changes are to take effect immediately.
