From the Pastor's Desk

Thank you Rachel!

When I became pastor at St. Charles I knew that I was not going to have an associate. This was unfortunate because, from what I heard, the associate worked with the youth. I also learned that our part-time youth director was leaving that summer. Because of these changes, and my conviction that we need to invest in our youth, I hired a full time youth director. Rachel Houglum accepted the position and has faithfully served the youth of our parish for almost 4 years. Her deep spiritual life was immediately evident as was her commitment to help our youth grow in their faith. She used these gifts to help build our youth program as well as a young adult program. In recent months she has discerned God calling her away from this position. We will greatly miss her presence around the parish office but we are happy that she and her husband, Ryan, will continue to remain in the parish and discern where they can offer their gifts elsewhere.

Please join me in thanking Rachel for her service to our parish and pray for her as she discerns where God is leading her in the future.

Welcome Andrew Wagenbach!

When Rachel informed me that she had discerned that she was leaving, she also informed me that a fellow youth director, Andrew Wagenbach, was looking for a position and she put me in contact with him. I spoke to Andrew several times and in our conversations I was excited to hear that we shared a vision for youth ministry in the parish. I will be asking him to spend more time in our school. He will work along with the school in enhancing the programs that already exist and creating more opportunities for our middle school children to become disciples of Jesus Christ.

He accepted the position and has been working with Rachel for the past couple weeks. We are currently at Camp Veritas, in South Dakota, and I am pleased to see how well

he gets along with the youth. He is married with 4 children and has many years of experience in youth ministry. We are very blessed to have him serving at St. Charles. He will assume the full time role of Youth Director on August 1st. Please welcome him and his family and pray for him as he begins the very important role of serving the youth and families of our parish.

Youth Room

You may have heard the sounds of construction happening in the basement of the church. We are renovating Bellermine chapel. For many years it has not been used as a chapel but instead as our youth room/Knights of Columbus meeting space. The youth have been meeting in various places and it became more clear that they needed a space dedicated for them. On the west end of the room there will be an area for instruction in the faith as well as an altar for prayer and adoration. In the middle of the room there will be a small living room space as well as an area for games. On the other east end of the room there will be a kitchenette and tables for meals and simply hanging out. We are adding a bathroom because we are anticipating more children using this space. This new dedicated youth space will be used more frequently by our youth and help them feel more welcome and at home in the Church.

I am very grateful to Tom Shamp and Carlson Levine for the overall coordination and heavy lifting of the project. Additional thanks needs to be given to the many other helping hands as the project is completed. In the near future, we will have an open house to allow you to see how *you* can help give an inviting, comfortable, fun space to our youth.

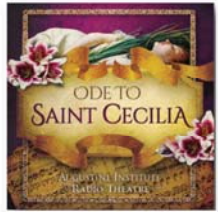


FOR CHILDREN

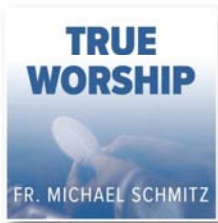
