

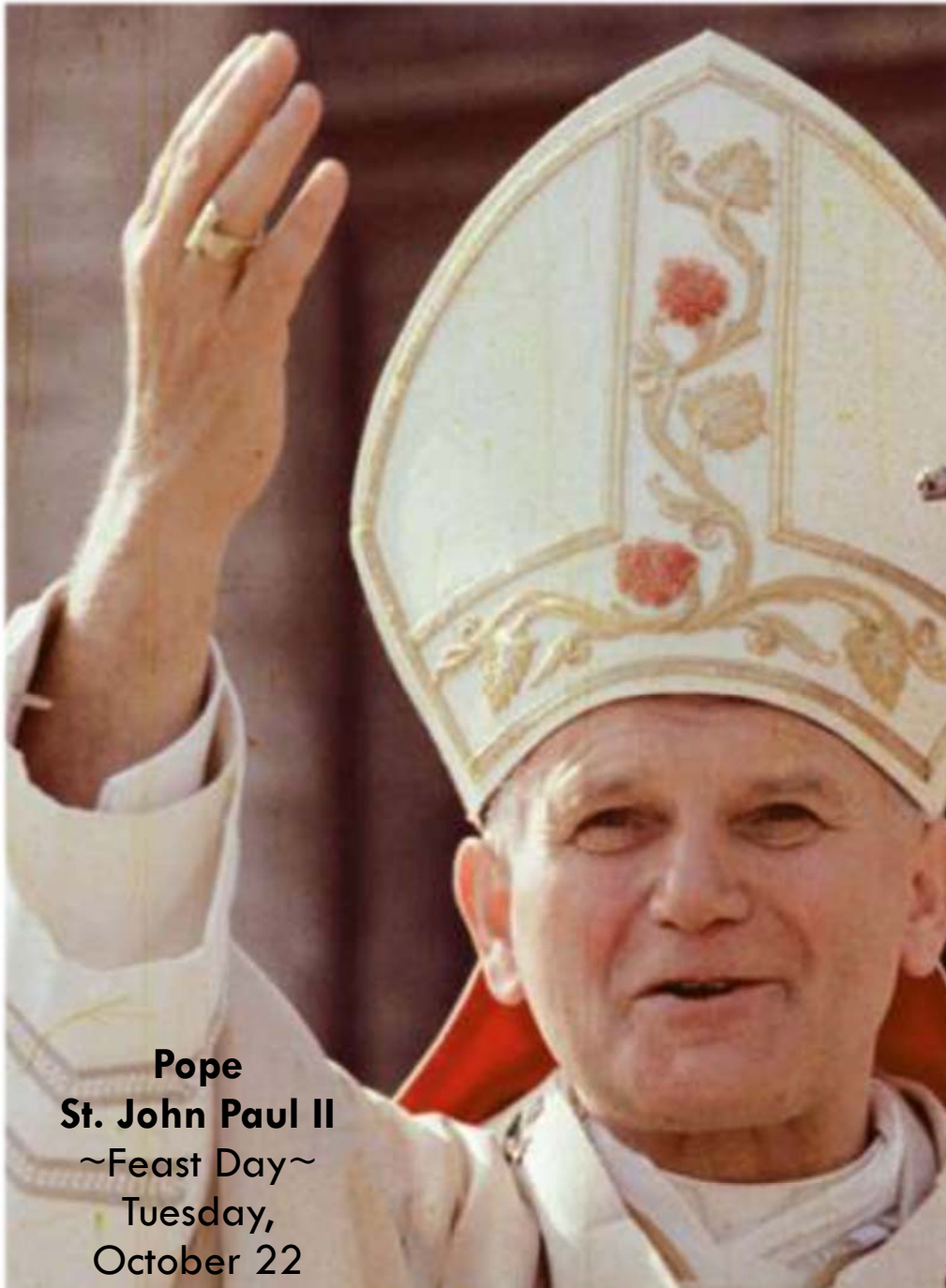

From the Pastor's Desk

During the Spring semester of 2001, I was studying in Rome. I had several opportunities to attend Masses and audiences with Pope John Paul II. I remember the first time that I attended an audience with the Pope. At the time he was in the advanced stages of Parkinson's disease. As the doors opened a hunched over, old and frail man dressed in white shuffled out to a chair. I am not an overly emotional person, so I was taken by surprise when I began to cry when I first saw the future saint.

I learned that I was not the only one to have these experiences. Despite his physical weakness, Pope John Paul II had a powerful presence about him. I believe that this power came from the Holy Spirit. He was not only the Vicar of Christ, he was truly a man of God.

On Tuesday, October 22, the anniversary of his papal inauguration, we celebrate his feast day. He was the second longest reigning pope. For 26 years he shepherded the Church through some very difficult times.

In 1976, shortly before he became Pope, he spoke at a bicentennial event in the U.S. He said these very prophetic and alarming words, *"We are now standing in the face of the greatest historical confrontation humanity has gone through. I do not think that wide circles of American society or wide circles of the Christian community realize this fully. We are now facing the final confrontation between the Church and the anti-Church, of the Gospel versus the anti-Gospel. We must be prepared to undergo great trials in the not-too-distant future; trials that will require us to be ready to give*

up even our lives, and a total gift of self to Christ and for Christ. Through your prayers and mine, it is possible to alleviate this tribulation, but it is no longer possible to avert it. . . How many times has the renewal of the Church been brought about in blood! It will not be different this time."

He was a man of great courage in the face of great evil that would bring fear to most people. He endured Nazi and Communist occupation and witnessed the deaths of many friends and family members. But yet, he still says that there is more and greater evil to come.

A fellow seminarian told me of the time that he met the Pope and told him that he wanted to be a priest. Pope John Paul II, with his strong voice, simply said, "Coraggio!" which is Italian for "Courage!" He knew of the struggles that he would face, not only in his vocation, but also in the world. In the world today it takes courage to live our faith. Let us ask St. John Paul II to pray for us so that we will receive the courage, that comes from God, to be able to fight the spiritual battles that lay ahead.

St. John Paul II, pray for us!

October 28 ONLY- St Faustina Documentary



In 1931, Jesus appeared to Faustina Kowalska as the King of Mercy. Clothed in a white robe and emanating two large rays from his side, one white and one red, He asked Faustina to paint this image of Himself along with the phrase, "Jesus, I trust in You" and to spread the message of mercy around the world. He promised that anyone who venerated this image would not perish. The gripping new docudrama LOVE AND MERCY presents unknown facts and recently disclosed documents that shed new light on the vision of Faustina.

Aided by scientific analysis, the film reveals how the Divine Mercy image and the Shroud of Turin were compared to one another to stunning conclusions. Dramatically recreated scenes between Saint Faustina and her confessor Father Michał Sopoćko traces the story of the origins of the image and how the devotion to Divine Mercy was born and spread throughout the world despite a ban of the devotion by the Catholic Church. Shot in the U.S., Poland and Lithuania, the film is a compelling hybrid of dramatization and documentary-style storytelling that will leave viewers in awe of this spectacular account of divine friendship.
