## From the Pastor's Desk

### St. Joseph Husband of Mary

On March 19, 2013, Pope Francis celebrated the Mass inaugurating his ministry as Pope. He chose this day because he has a devotion to St. Joseph. In his homily that day he said, "Joseph is a "protector" because he is able to hear God's voice and be guided by his will; and for this reason he is all the more sensitive to the persons entrusted to his safekeeping."

On May 1, 2013, the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker, Pope Francis issued his first decree on liturgical matters, entitled *Paternas Vices*. In this important document, he decrees that the name of St. Joseph should be inserted into Eucharistic Prayers II, III, and IV, effective immediately. It had already been included in Eucharistic prayer I. We pray for his intercession when the priest says, "with blessed Joseph her spouse."

St. Joseph has long been honored as the Patron Saint of the Universal Church. He earned this title given his protection of Jesus from the threat of Herod. The foster-father of the Son of God is also a father to us, who have become members of the Body of Christ in baptism. Therefore, it is fitting to remember St. Joseph at Holy Mass – when the Church, Christ's Mystical Body, gathers together. The Church is also called the family of faith. As patron of the universal Church, St. Joseph also protects and provides for this family, just as he did for the Holy Family.

As a way of preparing for our parish retreat I asked everyone in the parish to invoke his intercession by praying a novena to St. Joseph. I hope you have been praying. If you haven't, it's not too late to start!

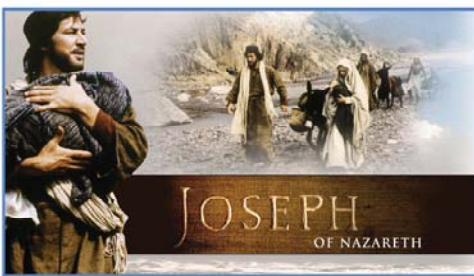
### Parish Retreat

Next Friday evening we begin our parish retreat entitled, Healing the Whole Parish. Providentially, the name of our retreat director is Joseph. Fr. Joseph Bambenek was ordained a priest in 2010 for the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. While serving as pastor he felt called to bring Jesus' healing ministry to the parish. He took a sabbatical focused on healing and has collaborated with the team at the John Paul II Healing Center through which he has been mentored by Dr. Bob Schuchts, who has written many books and offered many retreats on healing. His retreats are entitled "Healing the Whole Person." Fr. Bambenek asked him if he ever thought of leading a retreat entitled "Healing the Whole Parish." Dr. Bob said, "No, but maybe you should." And here we are. Fr. Bambenek has led retreats around the Archdiocese. We are blessed to have him here during this year where we are focusing on healing along The Way. He hopes that as a result of the retreat, we can each walk in greater freedom, less hampered by the hurts of the past in our lives, better able to fulfill God's wonderful vocation for our lives and that we can also have greater compassion for the people around us who are hurt and who act in unhelpful ways as a result.

## News & Upcoming Events at Our Parish

### Feast of St. Joseph is Thursday, March 19

*From a sermon by Saint Bernadine of Siena, priest:*

There is a general rule concerning all special graces granted to any human being. Whenever the divine favor chooses someone to receive a special grace, or to accept a lofty vocation, God adorns the person chosen with all the gifts of the Spirit needed to fulfill the task at hand.

This general rule is especially verified in the case of Saint Joseph, the foster-father of our Lord and the husband of the Queen of our world, enthroned above the angels. He was chosen by the eternal Father as the trustworthy guardian and protector of his greatest treasures, namely, his divine Son and Mary, Joseph's wife. He carried out this vocation with complete fidelity until at last God called him, saying: *Good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Lord.*

What then is Joseph's position in the whole Church of Christ? Is he not a man chosen and set apart? Through him and, yes, under him, Christ was fittingly and honorably introduced into the world. Holy Church in its entirety is indebted to the Virgin Mother because through her it was judged worthy to receive Christ. But after her we undoubtedly owe special gratitude and reverence to Saint Joseph.

In him the Old Testament finds its fitting close. He brought the noble line of patriarchs and prophets to its promised fulfillment. What the divine goodness had offered as a promise to them, he held in his arms.

Obviously, Christ does not now deny to Joseph that intimacy, reverence, and very high honor which he gave him on earth, as a son to his father. Rather we must say that in heaven Christ completes and perfects all that he gave at Nazareth.

Now we can see how the last summoning words of the Lord appropriately apply to Saint Joseph: *Enter into the joy of your Lord.* In fact, although the joy of eternal happiness enters into the soul of a man, the Lord preferred to say to Joseph: *Enter into*

*joy.* His intention was that the words should have a hidden spiritual meaning for us. They convey not only that this holy man possesses an inward joy, but also that it surrounds him and engulfs him like an infinite abyss.



Remember us, Saint Joseph, and plead for us to your foster-child. Ask your most holy bride, the Virgin Mary, to look kindly upon us, since she is the mother of him who with the Father and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns eternally. **Amen.**
